Accepted	A new Prison Safety Policy Framework will explain that the period following a video court hearing is one of heightened risk. It will restate the requirement that where a change of circumstances or demeanour has occurred as a result of such a hearing, a fresh assessment of risk must be undertaken, with all available, relevant information being considered and the prisoner being spoken to. It will emphasise the need to seek official information about the outcome of the proceedings for use in this assessment and that it must not be done solely on the basis of the prisoner's account.
