

STC survey methodology

A confidential survey of children is carried out by HMIP researchers at each STC on an annual basis.

HMI Prisons researchers developed a short self-completion questionnaire in October 2020 to support the assurance visit methodology. The questionnaire is offered to every child resident in the centre on the day of the survey. The questionnaire consists of structured questions covering key issues relating to the child's experience during the outbreak of COVID-19, together with demographic and background questions which enable us to compare responses from different subgroups of the STC population. There is also an open question after the questions relating to safety and at the end of the questionnaire which allows children to expand on any of their responses. All written comments are typed up and provided to the inspection team.

Distributing and collecting questionnaires

HMIP researchers distribute and collect the questionnaires in person. So that children can give their informed consent¹ to participate, the purpose of the survey and the inspection is explained. We make clear that the questionnaire can also be administered via a face-to-face interview for those who have literacy difficulties and via a telephone translation service for those with limited English.

Children are made aware that participation in the survey is voluntary. We also explain that while they do not need to put their name on the questionnaire, individual respondents can be identified via a numbering system which is only accessible to the inspection team. This is so that any child protection and safeguarding concerns can be followed up (see section below for further information).

Children who agree to participate in the survey are provided with a sealable envelope for their completed questionnaire, which will later be collected by researchers.

Child protection and safeguarding

All completed questionnaires are checked by researchers for potential child protection and safeguarding issues on the day of the survey. Any concerns are followed up by inspectors and passed on to centre staff if necessary.

Survey response

At the time of the survey on 20 October 2020 the population at Rainsbrook STC was 44. Using the approach described above, questionnaires were distributed to 43 children, one child was at court on the day of the survey and so did not receive a questionnaire. We received a total of 33 completed questionnaires, a response rate of 77%.

STC survey results and analyses

Over the following pages we present the full survey results followed by numerous comparative analyses for Rainsbrook STC. For the comparator analyses, where relevant, each question was reformulated using the Chi-square test (or Fisher's exact test if there are fewer than five expected counts in a cell) into a binary 'yes/no' format and affirmative responses compared. Missing responses have been excluded from all analyses and for some questions, responses from a sub-group of the sample are reported (as indicated in the data).

Full survey results

A full breakdown of responses is provided for every question. Percentages have been rounded and therefore may not add up to 100%.

Summary statistics for Rainsbrook STC 2020

• a percentage for the affirmative response for each question is provided.

Comparisons between self-reported sub-populations of prisoners within Rainsbrook STC 2020

- responses of children in self-identified racial minority groups are compared with those of white children.
- responses of children who reported that they had been in local authority care and those who said they had not.
- responses of children who reported that they had mental health problems compared with those who did not.

Please note that we only carry out within-prison comparator analysis where there is a minimum of 10 responses in each comparison group.

In the comparator analyses, statistically significant differences are indicated by shading. The probability threshold (i.e., p-value) is set at 0.01 which means that there is a 1% likelihood the statistically significant difference between the two groups is due to chance. Results that are significantly more positive are indicated by green shading and results that are significantly more negative are indicated by blue shading. Orange shading has been used to show a statistically significant difference in demographic or other background details. If there is no shading, any difference between the two results is not statistically significant and may have occurred by chance. Grey shading indicates that there is no valid comparative data for that question.
