### **Detainee survey methodology**

A representative survey of detainees is carried out at the start of every inspection, the results of which contribute to the evidence base for the inspection.

HMI Prisons researchers developed a self-completion questionnaire in May 2019 to support HMI Prisons' *Expectations*. The questionnaire consists of structured questions covering the detainee 'journey' from reception to removal/release together with demographic and background questions which enables comparison of responses from different sub-groups of the detainee population. There are also three open questions at the end of the questionnaire which allow detainees to express in their own words what they find most positive and negative about the IRC. Qualitative analysis of these written comments is undertaken by HMI Prisons researchers and used by inspectors.

### Sampling

For smaller IRCs or where the current detainee population is small, questionnaires are offered to every detainee. If the detainee population is large at the time of the survey, questionnaires are offered to a sample of detainees, using the following procedure. On the day of the survey a random sample is drawn by HMI Prisons researchers from a detainee population printout ordered by room location. Using a power calculation, HMI Prisons researchers calculate the minimum sample size required to ensure that the survey findings are representative of the entire population of the centre. The formula used in the calculation assumes a 65% response rate and a 95% confidence interval with a 7% margin of error.

### Distributing and collecting questionnaires

HMI Prisons researchers distributed and collected the questionnaires in person. A cover sheet was included with the questionnaire which explained the purpose of the survey and that participation was voluntary. Assurances were given about confidentiality, anonymity and the storage and retention of the data. Detainees were provided with a sealable envelope for their completed questionnaire and told when researchers would return to collect it. Due to social distancing measures researchers were not able to obtain verbal consent from detainees and therefore returned and completed questionnaires were deemed as providing consent. The questionnaire was available in 23 languages.

### **Survey responses**

At the time of the survey on 18 August 2025 the detainee population at Dungavel IRC was 140. Questionnaires were distributed to 139 detainees. It was not possible to offer a questionnaire to one detainee. We received a total of 92 completed questionnaires, a response rate of 66%.

### **Detainee survey results and analyses**

Over the following pages we present the full survey results followed by numerous comparative analyses for Dungavel IRC. For the comparator analyses, where relevant, each question was reformulated using the Chi-square test (or Fisher's exact test if there are fewer than five expected counts in a cell) into a binary 'yes/no' format and affirmative responses compared. Missing responses have been excluded from all analyses and for some questions, responses from a sub-group of the sample are reported (as indicated in the data).

# Responses from Dungavel IRC 2025 compared with those from other HMI Prisons surveys

These analyses are carried out on summary data from all survey questions. As we have been using a revised version of the questionnaire since May 2019, we do not yet have full comparator data for all questions.

- Survey responses from Dungavel IRC in 2025 compared with survey responses from other IRCs inspected since August 2022.
- Survey responses from Dungavel IRC in 2025 compared with survey responses from Dungaval IRC in 2021.

## Comparisons between self-reported sub-populations of detainees within Dungavel IRC 2025

These analyses are carried out on summary data from selected survey questions only.

- Responses of detainees aged 25 and under compared with those aged over 25.
- Responses of detainees from all other ethnic groups combined are compared with those of white detainees.
- Responses of Muslim detainees compared with those of non-Muslim detainees.
- Responses of detainees who reported that they had a disability compared to those who did not.
- Responses of detainees who reported that they had mental health problems compared with those who did not.
- Responses of detainees with female, non-binary or other gender identities compared with those of male detainees.
- Responses of non-heterosexual detainees compared with heterosexual detainees.
- Responses of detainees who reported not being able to understand written or spoken English very / quite well compared with those who can.
- Responses of detainees who reported that they had been held in prison in the UK compared with those of detainees who reported that they had not been held in prison in the UK.

Please note that we only carry out within-IRC comparator analysis where there is a minimum of 10 responses in each comparison group.

In the comparator analyses, statistically significant differences are indicated by shading. The probability threshold (i.e. p-value) is set at 0.01 which means that there is a 1% likelihood the statistically significant difference between the two groups is due to chance. Results that are significantly more positive are indicated by green shading and results that are significantly more negative are indicated by blue shading. Orange shading has been used to show a statistically significant difference in demographic or other background details. If there is no shading, any difference between the two results is not statistically significant and may have occurred by chance. Grey shading indicates that there are no valid comparative data for that question.

Filtered questions are indented and preceded by an explanation in italics of how the filter has been applied. In the comparator analyses, percentages for filtered questions refer to the number of respondents filtered to that question. For all other questions, percentages refer to the total number of valid responses to the question.
