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History: Saw: **D1713** following urgent referral/ request made by doctor. Waited on C wing until **D1713** was out of the shower.

Was pleasant and appropriate on approach, said he has been feeling depressed since he was detained yesterday. States that he was living in **DPA** before he was taken to Brook House. Claimed that an argument developed at his home after the other tenants failed to keep the place clean/tidy. Police was called and he was arrested and taken to a police station where he was later picked up and taken to this centre.

Said he has committed any crime and does not know why he was detained further claims that he was born in Italy and by Nigerian Parent and was naturalised there. Said this can be confirmed by his solicitor who has his birth certificate. Very distressed, as he complains about the effect being in detention is having on his and the possibility of him being deported to Nigeria.

**D1713** said he was physically abused by his uncle whom he went to live with as a child after the death of his father. Said was beaten and burnt. Showed several marks on his hands, the back of his neck and his feet to confirm this. Claims that he is having flashbacks of these experiences and that of his mother who was stripped naked by his uncle once, said this hurts. went on to say his story is complicated and he does not want to go to Nigeria.

Says he can never see his children grow up in Nigeria if he was to get any in the future, adding to this **D1713** said being in Brook House makes him feel like he is a dog and this is not the place for him to be. Said his partner is sectioned and being treated for depression.

Tearful and at times place his hands over his face and draw his beard, "said please god, don't let me do something stupid". "I don't want to harm myself". Did reports that he had not eaten since he arrived at Brook House, However he did have lunch after he was seen. Was supported and encourage to ventilate during the time he was seen

Was later seen with S. Dix and was placed on an ACDT with hourly observation, There was no current suicidal thought or self harm ideation reported. Said he has send a letter to immigration stating that he would like to make an asylum claim. Went to collect his meal after he appears to have calmed down. Advised to seek help whenever he has any concern.

Plan: RMN support /mental health review on the 02/04/17, Nurse will see **D1713** on his wing.

Went to church yesterday and prayer service at night, said he is comfortable with his room mate who is very supportive and would not like to change wing or share with another person after he was asked if he would like to be transfer to another wing that is much quieter.

Says "I might look big, but my emotions are f\*\*\*\* up". Support was given with advised for him to seek help from an officer whenever things get too much for him.

Said he has no suicidal thoughts and he will not harm himself. Advised attend at time given for his prescribed medication.

Plan: Hourly observation with 2 conversation daily.

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History: Seen for his ACDT Review with P. Page. Complains that he is still having some difficulty coping with being detained, but has been observing the advice that was given by mental health nurses and is finding them effective. Reports that there are some detainees that are making sexual advances towards him and he is not comfortable with it because he is not a Gay. This and other concerns such as his immigration being detained was sent in a letter to Immigration.

Said he has been going to the toilet quite frequently for the past couple of days, eg (4 times during the day) .. Said he has an appointment to to healthcare return on Monday 10/04/17. Not comfortable eating the food here, but he tries to eat everyday.

Was asked if he was sexually abused in the past by DCM, his personality was changed following this question: D1713

D1713 said "please, please don't go there I don't want to go back to my pass". "I don't want to remember what me and my sister had been through". The topic was changed as a result of this, but was reassured that he can speak to us at healthcare or the manager if change his mind and would like to talk to someone at anytime. Said he has been going to the gym and playing football. These are what he said has been helping him to cope a little.

Confirms he sometimes plays football and attends church, said he left his room as he is allowed to do so, because he cannot cope with being locked inside. Was encouraged to continue was reminded about his prescribed medication. Said he will go to healthcare for same tonight. Has applied for bail, does not seem to happy with the service he is getting from his solicitor. Advised to see the welfare officer and request to see someone from Gatwick welfare who might be able to help with getting some books that he has he loves to read. He was advised to speak to welfare about BID also. Support and reassurance was given.

To remain on 1 observation every 2 hours with 2 good quality conversation daily.

Plan: To continue socialising /play foot ball and attend gym.

To remain proactive with his current immigration situation.

D1713 is report any incident of sexual harrasment to an officer or DCM whenever this happens, also wheever he has any concern.
