

Report on the outcome of allegations of inappropriate behaviour by G4S staff at the Gatwick Immigration Removal Centres highlighted by the BBC Documentary:

Panorama "Undercover: Britain's Immigration Secrets" aired on Monday 4th September 2017

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1. Executive Summary

Brook House Investigations (8 Dismissals)

Following receipt of the allegations by the BBC (Panorama) G4S commissioned 2 Investigation Teams to investigate and review each allegation.

The investigations were split into two categories;

- Staff related incidents
- Management of operational processes

The findings/recommendations of each category are included in Sections 2 and 4

A total of 55 initial investigations have been completed. Upon completion, each investigation has been discussed to challenge if the evidence is sufficient to clarify the correct process has been followed or if there is further investigatory work required.

Of the 55, 4 were Home Office related and we recommend that these are passed to the Home office

Findings

Oscar 1's diary shows that the roll was incorrect, but unlock was authorised by the Duty Director, (M Brown). This was not recorded in the Duty Director Diary. Security investigation states that the numbers were one over and there was confusion over the number of detainees on constant supervision. No evidence that a standfast roll check took place which the policy said should have happened.

Allegation

Detainee was found unconscious in his bed following a reaction to PS.

Findings

Report from DAT on 25/04 shows at lunch time unlock **D343** was 'asleep, left side, snoring, (rather than unconscious as reported by the BBC), sick on deck and bed, medical response called and h/c attended'. Reported to the police and RAPT referral made 26/04. H/c assessed him on the day 25/04 and deemed him suitable to remain on the wing. Reported that he appeared under the influence of NPS. Daily log shows when the incident occurred and confirms that h/c attended. IR and F213 completed.

Use of spice reached epidemic proportions during Christmas 2016

Findings

Corruption Prevention operation took place and a member of staff was suspended. Availability of 'spice' reduced.

Detainees say take Spice, suffer depression or become angry as a result of being incarcerated for an indeterminate period of time. It is only a matter of time before a detainee leaves in a body bag

Incident report 302/17 indicates Detainee being on rule 40 in E007, but unclear why or what regime access he had. BBC document references refusing to leave D wing courtyard, but no evidence to review around this incident.

No record of room clearance being completed, but it is unclear if someone else was put in his room as there is no room record for 22nd & 23rd. Already in E-wing on 24th.

States D1440 due ACDT case review today, Safer Custody informed, but email from Kelly Harris to James Begg also in section states to check DCO Sheharyar knows how to open an ACDT (possibly standard procedure as D1440 already on ACDT?). DAT entries re: ACDT reviews 22/5/17 - 9/6/17 show D1440 initially upset about some of his medication being stopped despite it not being to do with his mental state and in one review states 'they are trying to kill me' (29/5/17) but this in reference to his medication. By 3/6/17 D1440 appears much brighter / calmer and is talking about working as a Safer Community Orderly. ADCT closed 9/6/17. D1440 removed 25/6/17. No reference to violence or racial abuse from staff or fears about staff violence (or even other detainee violence). No evidence in security file re: any other detainees.

Levels of violence at Gatwick are amongst the lowest of our establishments. There was a peak in June related to a small number of specific incidents rather than a general deterioration and levels of violence have fallen significantly in July and August. The anti-bully and violence reduction strategies reference 6 monthly surveys of detainees to assess the climate in the centre.
