Dear Mr **D1914**

I am directed by the Secretary of State to inform you that they have taken note of your conviction on **Sensitive/Irrelevant** at court for **Sensitive/Irrelevant** for which you were sentenced to **Sensitive/Irrelevant** imprisonment.

A person who would otherwise be entitled to reside under the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006 may be removed from the United Kingdom if the Secretary of State decides that the person's removal is justified on grounds of public policy or public security in accordance with regulation 21 of these Regulations. Where such a decision is taken, removal will be by way of deportation in accordance with regulation 24(3).


A person who is deported is **Sensitive/Irrelevant** prohibited from returning to the United Kingdom while the deportation order remains in force.

The Secretary of State has given consideration to your successful appeal against deportation and has decided to take no further action on this occasion.

However, should you commit any further offences the Home Office may, once again, seek to pursue your deportation.

The contractors have been requested to contact you to arrange for the removal of your tag and tagging equipment.
