March 7th 2017

20.50 Four men walked peacefully from Eden wing

21.00 Three men on netting on B wing. Another apparently walking around landing who was thought to have razor blades in his mouth

21.25 One man, [D3782] brought to CSU via back stairs. We (on E wing) could hear the noise but not see. Door not opened by staff so as not to cause a diversion).

[D3782] secured behind his door, in conversation with an officer who supplied him with a cigarette and light. On constant observation until they were sure he was settled.

A wing called for support — one officer went over.

22.05 observed B wing. Men still on netting, walking round and using phones. About eight officers in kit, some at each end of netting, and other officers.

22.32 Tascor officers arrived to take over responsibility for Mr [D3782]. He came peacefully out of his cell (with officers standing by) and was walked to the Tascor staff. They introduced themselves, individually. They stood in a half-circle around him; the 'lead' spoke almost continually, and in a soft voice, explaining that [D3782] would definitely be on the flight, that he would be searched and given a waist restraint. He complied fully with the instructions given and walked from the back of the CSU to the vans.

23.25 DCM Juls Williams handed papers to the three men on the netting which I was told confirmed that their departure had been cancelled. They did not come off.

Throughout the evening, while I was there, I observed officers being deployed from one wing to another as necessary and a team of medical staff who went wherever they were wanted. I did not observe any medical interventions.

I left at approx 23.45

17/5/17 Serious Incident on Netting

D275

DPA

Jumped on to the netting 10.36. At some point he climbed off to return with his mattresses + duvet, where he proceeded to make himself comfortable. The situation was monitored by Gilly Gajdatsy during the morning but the decision taken was to allow normal regime to continue on A wing and wait for him to come off, while staff + inmates engaged him in conversation.

Issue: - he had gone to LGW for a flight back to Algeria to find no travel documents so was not allowed to board. He had caused damage at the alp before being returned to Brock House.

2.00 Our board meeting proceeded in the boardroom with a screen showing the scene + Michelle Brown as DS + Silver talking to us and dealing with the incident. Around 12.30 Jerry Pethick as Gold authorised the National C+R team to be called as it was felt would not budge.

15.45 G.G. went to A wing. As I was leaving I found the Nat. team had arrived + their vans occupied the yard. I, therefore, went to the Control Room - the Command Suite was not opened.

6.00 The Nat team leader was taken to the dojo for briefing
6.40 hook up was called
6.45 Medical response called for a man on the 3s -

suspected NPS - he was moved to the stairway for initial treatment + then to E wing for obs.

6.50 Gilly asked to leave wing: 'danger from Pava spray.'
7.15 Teams enter wing. I see them talking to who stays on his mattress. Then he is raised to his

feet + manhandled over the rails + out thro the
back stairs to the yard. I can see him being
supported in the fresh air - it is raining quite hard.
The nurse told me later fresh air is the only relief to
allow the pava spray to disperse. He is then walking
to CSU, seen by nurses, searched etc.

I went to CSU. **D275** under constant obs for first
hour + an officer was talking to him so I could go
in to the room. Red faced + very irritated eyes, in a
lot of discomfort though he said it was lessening - no
other damage, he said. Talked about his caseworker
letting him down when she had promised everything was
OK. Said I'd see him tomorrow

18/5/17 Spoke to Michelle Smith about airport
failed removal. Embassy failed to provide documents
but did not tell HQ till last minute. HQ failed to
communicate the info effectively in the small window so
at least **D275** would not have been taken to a/p.
Every effort being made to find him a new flight -
not easy.

SERIOUS INCIDENT 29/11/17

I was called a bit after 1900 by Michelle Brown, Head of Security. She had tried first to phone rota member Luis Hui. There had been an on-going incident on C Wing more or less since 08.05 am when a first response was called. In her briefing I was told that the episode had involved some 45 detainees at various times, damage to centre property, at least one man on the netting, a room set on fire, detainees wielding poles and a lot of noise. Both at 12.00 and 17.00 large groups had refused to lock up. Michelle and the others had spent all day talking to the detainees to defuse the situation, including forums of small groups to examine their issues. In between whiles they had been fed and had association in the normal way to allow the rest of the wing to act normally. Nevertheless, it was a threatening situation, she told me, but Michelle did not want to pull all staff off and "lose" the wing. At one point on the advice of a detainee preparations were made for female officers to leave because fighting was threatened. By the time I heard the news the decision had been taken to open the Command Suite and call in the National team. I spoke to rota member Lui and we worked out I could get there faster to assess the situation and he'd follow on as necessary. I phoned Dick to take over telephone coordination.

I arrived soon after 20.00 pm to find the incident was over. I saw the fire officer who had been to check the room fire was safely out. Michelle briefed me in the yard that the detainees had suddenly started to right the pool table, sweep up the mess and mop the floors. Officer Ramon helped them. And then all detainees locked up compliantly. I advised Lui and Dick they could stand down but stayed myself to stay and see the four alleged ringleaders taken to CSU. Trouble was expected and I watched two teams kit up and prepare. The National team stayed to help. I heard Michelle advise the teams to "go in hard" if detainees refused to cooperate to cut down the opportunity for resistance and the possibility of injury to detainee and officers.

At 20.50 **D642** walked compliantly to CSU. By 21.15 all was ready except for Healthcare. Eventually, Sandra Calver arrived and everyone made their way to C Wing. At 21.30 the team went into room 105(?) and **D1159** refused to comply. I did not have a clear view from across the landing but could see Sandra right inside the room watching the situation. I gathered that **D1159** was using his strength to wedge himself, making it very difficult for the officers to get a hold. It took 20 minutes to get him out of the room and down the stairs, with some intervention from the national team. I followed the group to CSU and watched the search. Steve Skitt said it was going to be a "full relocation". **D1159** stood laughing and giggling throughout the search.

The last three: **D3783** at 22.00 pm, **D1249** at 22.25 and **D1343** all walked down compliantly. I watched **D3783** and Mr **D1249** located in CSU – they seemed very full of themselves and in no way injured. The hot debrief was carried out in the staff room and was brief. Most officers had been on duty all day. I saw Lee and Steve still in the centre as I left at 22.45.

The following morning I returned to the Centre to watch the R40 reviews, beginning about 10.00 am. Again Lui was willing to come if needed. I saw reviews of 4 of the 5 from last night and spoke to each afterwards with just an officer in the doorway. Most said they were

indignant about being kept in the CSU when they considered they had ended the protest themselves. The DD pointed out that refusal to lock up in itself merited R40. **D3783** issue was his phone which Tascor had taken away in error. He had been on the netting but claimed to have talked people into compliance. **D642** said he should not be kept locked up and denied involvement in the incident. His move to Morton Hall had been cancelled at short notice which was frustrating. He said he had been promised that if he walked down to CSU he would not be locked up – DD to investigate. **D1249** denied he had been on the netting or done damage as his paperwork claimed. He wanted flipflaps and jacket from his prop which the Oscar said he would arrange. **D1159** apologised for his behaviour and asked for his property and phone and an early decision as to what was to happen to him. The intention is to move all the ringleaders out of the centre either on RDs, back to prison or to other IRCs.

I completed the R40 paperwork and made a quick visit to C Wing to see how it was post-incident. At the time I was on the wing there was little activity and the officers told me the atmosphere had settled.

Apologies for lateness of this note, but I was locked out of cjsm on Monday evening when I first tried to report. Thanks to Jackie for sorting it out for me.

I received a phone call from Jackie on Sunday 3rd December at about 7.30 pm regarding an incident at Brook House. Steve Skitt was on his way in and it was felt that the IMB should also attend.

I arrived at Brook around 8.20 pm and went to the control room, where the incident was being monitored. When I got to the control room I could see a detainee sitting on a chair on top of a round table, which in turn was on top of the pool table in E wing. Steve Skitt was in attendance as was James Begg.

My understanding of the background to the incident was that the detainee, [redacted] D1159 was on Rule 40 in CSU and was on a 3 person unlock because of his previous behaviour. Sometime in the afternoon on Sunday (not sure of the time) he asked for a cigarette and an officer opened his door to give him one and was immediately "rushed" by [redacted] D1159 who recognised that there was only one officer not 3. An officer from E wing went to assist in CSU and was similarly pushed out of the way and hence [redacted] D1159 got onto E wing. One detainee, [redacted] D1249 and possibly [redacted] D642 as well, apparently tried to calm [redacted] D1249 down. All E wing detainees were put back into their rooms, whilst [redacted] D1159 arranged his high level seating on the pool table.

Steve Skitt informed me that the intention was to see the situation through to a successful conclusion by negotiating with [redacted] D1159. 2 negotiators had been talking to [redacted] D1159 since about 5.45 pm. The command suite was not opened and there was no intention to call in the nationals, although a C and R team was kitted up and was based in the CSU office and another C and R team was on standby.

As mentioned above, I got to Brook about 8.20 and it was clear that the negotiators were talking to the detainee all the time. Out of the blue at just before 9pm, [redacted] D1159 got down and took the chair and table back to where they belonged and went into CSU. He asked to change his room and this request was granted. He was locked up at about 9.10 pm.

I attended the hot debrief at about 9.20 and all attendees were pleased with the not violent, successful conclusion. The negotiators had obviously done a good job in difficult circumstances. One E wing officer said that some level of thanks should also go to [redacted] D1249 who was helpful in calming down [redacted] D1159 at the start of the incident.

I hope that this helps.
