- 20 **Joe Marshall**: [laughs], 'two [inaudible]'.
- 21 **Ed Fiddy**: [inaudible]
- Joe Marshall: [inaudible] that's such a [inaudible].
- 23 **Callum Tulley:** Who is he? Let's see a picture of him? Did he get wrapped up?
- 24 **Joe Marshall:** No, I don't think so.
- 25 Callum Tulley: Oh, right, right. What's going on mate?
- 26 **Ed Fiddy: DX4** not allowed in the kitchen
- 27 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, I heard. It's good really, well, not saying i's good, but he's, he doesn't
- 28 stop like, he's just so always on your case always trying to get you to get him in. It is quite
- 29 frustrating.
- 30 **Ed Fiddy:** he came up to me in [inaudible] Put someone else's name in there? I'm not doing
- 31 that.
- 32 **Callum Tulley:** I think its cause he's he's told me it's .
- 33 **Joe Marshall:** He's a bit of a dick, isn't he? In all honesty
- 34 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.
- 35 **Ed Fiddy:** [inaudible]
- **Joe Marshall:** He's become, he's become quite a bit of a penis.
- 37 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: DX4** He's been banned from cooking now?
- 38 Callum Tulley: I think the problem is he's made quite a lot of inappropriate comments towards
- 39 female staff and he's been banned because obviously, there's just a lone female in there, and
- 40 he's got. Obviously, he doesn't have access to the knives, but they're only in like a plastic
- 41 cabinet, do you know what I mean?. You know, it's not like they're hard to access, if he really,
- 42 really wanted to.
- 43 **Ed Fiddy:** I think it's a bit dodgy, to be fair. Like an Aramark girl sitting in a locked room.
- 44 **Joe Marshall:** I'm in agreement with that.
- 45 **Ed Fiddy:** There's a camera there, but who is watching that in concurrent?
- 46 **Joe Marshall:** [inaudible] the majority [inaudible] in concurrent?
- 47 **Ed Fiddy:** No? No they don't. Unless someone's actually got a reason to look?
- 48 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, it's not great I think June, she quite often gets a bit upset.
- 49 **Joe Marshall:** They shouldn't be doing it, they're Aramark, and they're not [inaudible] cultural
- 50 kitchen. It's not really right, it should be the way it used to be when they didn't have the
- 51 kitchen, they did it in the main kitchen. So they'd have to be cleared like a kitchen worker has
- 52 to be cleared. Cause obviously [inaudible] has to be clear.
- 53 Callum Tulley: Yeah, that's how it used to be but I think when they introduced this knives 'no
- 54 knives' thing, yeah, so.

- Joe Marshall: Then they said no knives didn't they. Oh actually take it back; they obviously
- June and that, down the kitchen [inaudible] all the time.
- **Ed Fiddy:** But its more than that.
- **Joe Marshall:** The thing is, though, the problem we've got is it's right by all the other cunts,
- innit? So, they must all turn up all day long like.
- **Ed Fiddy:** banging on the door. They do, they do kind of.
- **Unknown:** How did Dan get on bed watch?
- **Callum Tulley:** I got asked to do it, as well, last night, but I thought—

- **Joe Marshall:** I mean, I've done it, fuck me it's horrible.
- **Callum Tulley:** What?
- **Joe Marshall:** When you get sent out and then they sap someone. I've done one with Octavian
- once. Can you imagine that? Imagine that.
- **Ed Fiddy:** That's horrific. [inaudible]
- **Joe Marshall:** Exactly.
- **Ed Fiddy:** I fucking hate it when he rings me.
- 78 Joe Marshall: Octavian and Daly. Three man bed watch, me, Octavian and cant remember the
- 79 third one.
- **Callum Tulley:** Ah no, Octavian's alright, I feel bad for Octavian sometimes.
- **Joe Marshall:** He's a fucking idiot.
- **Ed Fiddy:** Every time he rings I just want to slam the phone down.
- **Joe Marshall:** [Inaudible] He's another one, mate, trust me.
- **Callum Tulley:** Is he?
- **Joe Marshall:** He's the ultimate pro-detainees.
- **Callum Tulley:** Aw yeah I know that yeah.
- 87 Joe Marshall: Like, horrendous for it. One too far and that's that. You know, to the point
- 88 where

- 89 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, no, that is true. But as a person, he's alright, he's a nice—do you know
- 90 what I mean
- 91 **Ed Fiddy:** [inaudible] he always rings up 'hello its Octavian on the phone.'
- 92 **Joe Marshall:** Oh, shut up. [inaudible] I bet he goes [inaudible] computer.
- 93 **Callum Tulley:** He wouldn't hurt a fly, though.
- 94 **Joe Marshall:** He's a fucking useless cunt.
- 95 **Ed Fiddy:** He rings down to the library right, He rings down to the library right?
- 96 **Callum Tulley:** A bit strong Joe?
- 97 **Joe Marshall:** He's a useless cunt. He might be a nice bloke, but on a work basis he's a useless
- 98 cunt. [inaudible]. Mate, you didn't used to be out in the wings with him.
- 99 Callum Tulley: Yeah, I'm not, I'm not -
- 100 Joe Marshall: Trust me, mate, he's unbelievable. The other week, right, he was like going
- 101 back to when he used to be residential. There was a geezer on B wing right, any one of us,
- 102 right? Geezer's gone, remember the Italian bloke who used to collapse all the time?
- 103 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, yeah.
- 104 **Ed Fiddy:** Yeah. [inaudible]
- 105 **Joe Marshall:** It was funny, innit!
- 106 **Ed Fiddy:** was that not too long ago?
- 107 **Joe Marshall:** He stood there, and he went, he stood there and he went [speaker makes an
- "urghh" sound]. Me and a couple of the boys were like "really?" Darren Thomsett I think. And
- then he just went [gestures] and he was lying on the floor like that yeah and we were like
- "really?". I just walked off, Dan just got on the radio and said , can I have healthcare up to B
- wing, you know, no panic. I walked off. Didn't see that Octavian was behind the stairs and that.
- Next thing I got off of B wing and that and there's first response like India whatever, and then
- they're saying a personal alarm Octavian Strat, I didn't know he was on B wing. You know,
- when they're announcing "what's your location, over" -
- 115 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, I remember that!
- 116 Joe Marshall: I turned around and was like "what the fuck", all the first response are running
- to B wing. I looked at him and I seen he's stood there over the detainee. I grabbed all of them
- and I was like "really?", I was like what you doing here, nothing wrong with him. As soon as
- everyone walked in they went "huh?". He's stood there, when the bloke's collapsed, obviously
- 120 I've walked off, and he's gone "holy shit" you know [gestures to the floor]. You think Jesus
- mate, he's a big bloke, grow some balls, innit? Trust me, [inaudible], he's a cunt. Nice bloke,
- 122 I'm sure. But I'm talking about on a colleague basis.
- 123 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.
- 124 **Ed Fiddy:** And then he rings me and he goes oh can you put this guy on the emergency solicitor
- 125 list.
- **Joe Marshall:** There you go, there you go! They're manipulated him.

- 127 **Ed Fiddy:** [inaudible]it was on the fucking public drive.
- 128 **Joe Marshall:** Oh, poor little poppet. That's what he's, another one of them.
- 129 **Callum Tulley:** yeah yeah yeah.
- 130 **Joe Marshall:** Awww [said in a mimicking tone].
- 131 **Ed Fiddy :** [inaudible] I was like no [inaudible]
- 132 **Joe Marshall:** [inaudible]
- 133 **Ed Fiddy:** Can you take someone else off the list? No.
- 134 **Callum Tulley:** He's got the public drive up himself, though, hasn't he?
- 135 **Joe Marshall:** Yeah, It's got so bad here and all innit, everything is unprofessional innit. I
- mean, we were like, but it's just shocking, innit?
- 137 Callum Tulley: What?
- 138 **Joe Marshall:** Can you just sign me on? [inaudible] that's what they said. [inaudible] I went
- really? The other day, when he was like "can you hear me?" like it's not a walkie talkie. Look
- at them balls, [inaudible]. I bet you didn't order them balls.
- 141 Callum Tulley: Of course, he didn't.
- 142 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: Fucking stupid balls.
- 143 **Joe Marshall:** What the fuck.
- 144 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: [inaudible] bounced that.
- 145 **Joe Marshall:** I know mate, in the air.
- 146 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: They wouldn't last a minute there. They wouldn't even play with
- 147 them.
- 148 **Joe Marshall:** that or [inaudible]
- 149 **Ed Fiddy:** Tough shit. That or no balls at all.
- 150 **Callum Tulley:** I say we just get—
- 151 **Ed Fiddy:** That's all good, how about whoever ordered them—
- 152 **Callum Tulley:** It was alright it was a bit boring.
- 153 **Unknown:** [inaudible]
- 154 **Ed Fiddy:** Were you out long?
- 155 Callum Tulley: We were out for ages, and he just got his finger bandaged up, they could have
- 156 done it here in healthcare.
- 157 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** Somebody [inaudible]
- 158 **Joe Marshall:** [laughter]
- 159 **Ed Fiddy:** Who was you with?
- 160 Callum Tulley: We were literally waiting, we waited for an x-ray for about two hours, and then
- we waited for this bandage to be done for about two hours.

- **Callum Tulley:** It'll have to be sports officer, won't it?
- **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** but you said erm [Inaudible]
- **Ed Fiddy:** oh you getting it re-felted are you?

- 174 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: you said erm huh?

- 178 off there's this female officer, she has literally been working here a month and she was left
- on her own completely in charge of the whole fucking wing.

- **Callum Tullley:** that short one, Victoria, that blonde girl.
- **Joe Marshall:** The one that walks funny?
- **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, yeah.
- **Joe Marshall:** There you go. There you go.
- **Radio:** [inaudible]
- **Ed Fiddy:** Gary Croucher?
- **Callum Tulley:** Gary's good in control, he used to work up there, yeah.
- **Joe Marshall:** Oh, Croucher? Croucher's good, yeah. Yeah, he's good in control.
- **Male Officer 1**: Yeah he is
- **Ed Fiddy:** Siggins.
- **Joe Marshall:** Siggins is good in control.
- **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, he is.
- **Joe Marshall:** I'm good in control. In my years' experience [inaudible].
- **Ed Fiddy:** Do you know where Kerry is?
- **Unknown:** [Inaudible]

- **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** He's supposed to be here.
- **Callum Tulley** He's gone to Tinsley, hasn't he, Purnell

- **Ed Fiddy:** Yeah, He's on my line
- 227 Male Officer 1: [Inaudible]
- **Callum Tulley:** [Inaudible]. It's a Tuesday, isn't it?

- 229 **Joe Marshall:** [burps], pardon me.
- 230 **Callum Tulley:** Fucking hell, Joe.
- 231 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: [inaudible] parking behind the kitchen, and they'll be working from
- there. All the stuff they need to do [inaudible]
- 233 **Unknown:** Who's in IT then?
- 234 **Callum Tulley:** I'm in IT.
- 235 **Unknown:** you'll have to search the cultural kitchen then.
- 236 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, it's alright.
- 237 **Ed Fiddy:** Yeah, careful with the Facebook, me and Ginge are taking some serious heat the
- 238 other day.
- 239 **Unknown:** Oh yeah?
- 240 **Callum Tulley:** What through? I don't go on Facebook.
- 241 **Ed Fiddy:** No, no I meant them.
- 242 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, them lot, oh right.
- 243 **Joe Marshall:** You ever [inaudible]?
- 244 Callum Tulley: What do you mean taking some serious heat? Did someone catch you on
- 245 Facebook or something?
- 246 **Ed Fiddy:** Some detainee [inaudible] he started squaring up to me and Ginge.
- 247 **Callum Tulley:** What, because you were blocking them, you weren't letting them on Facebook?
- 248 **Ed Fiddy:** Yeah.
- 249 **Callum Tulley:** Good for you, man. Too right. No, I'll be doing the same, don't worry. They're
- 250 not allowed on Facebook, so they're not going on Facebook. Simples.
- 251 **Ed Fiddy:** They're basically like, 'your mum's going to die of cancer' and all this shit.
- 252 **Joe Marshall:** Albanians?
- 253 **Ed Fiddy:** No Moroccans.
- 254 **Unknown:** Ugh
- 255 **Ed Fiddy: Absolute cunts**[Inaudible]
- 256 **Callum Tulley:** Don't worry mate, I won't undermine you. Do we open the downstairs IT in
- 257 the morning, no we don't need to do that? The thing that is so annoying about this IT room is
- 258 there's still, in the main room, it's fine, you can see who is on what computer. In the next
- room, you don't know who is using what computer, so when they're on Facebook or porn, or
- 260 whatever, can't block, you don't know. You can block, obviously, on the computer, but you

773 774 775	Callum Tulley: There's no—the two chin-up bars have gone; the push-up bars have gone. The punching bags are gone, the gloves are gone. The shoulder press machine is broken. We've been reporting it in this folder, but nothing's been done.
776 777 778	Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: Do you see? You see that [inaudible] that I think is involved? Calling people to do this, do that, telling people to come in and do this and do that. [inaudible] If he doesn't give a shit then why should I give a shit?
779	Callum Tulley: Who? Who doesn't give a shit?
780	Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: Juls doesn't give a shit.
781	Callum Tulley: Your manager?
782	Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: Juls doesn't give a shit.
783	Callum Tulley: Oh. Juls
784 785	Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: I said to him, there's a guy outside there waiting to do the pool tables [inaudible] and you escort him around. Oh, ok. 20 minutes later, they call me [inaudible]

- and still the guy is still waiting out there. And I said you have got to—oh. And I said to Dan
- 787 can you go and do that. [inaudible] that guy all day.
- 788 **Callum Tulley:** Jules is on the senior management team, isn't he?
- 789 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: He is. Dan is doing it now, Dan Lake is walking around with the
- 790 guy now doing the pool tables.
- 791 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, they're still doing it? [sighs]
- 792 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** I think that's it, really cos they have quite a few tables to do innit.
- 793 [Inaudible] But, only because I talked [inaudible] he'd still be there.
- 794 **Callum Tulley:** Oh yeah.
- 795 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: I think it's very bad, you know? Because he was out there and all
- 796 this [inaudible] that's why I wanted to get out of here, because I see everything getting broken
- on the mess in there. Look at that, I'm never leaving the office in a mess like that.
- 798 **Callum Tulley:** Mm-hmm.
- 799 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** [inaudible] all those balls in there, all the equipment in there like
- that, buying those cheap fucking things. They don't last. Those things, are like for children,
- they'rebouncy shit. You give [inaudible] they throw it back at you, I'm telling you. If you give
- one ball to them, I'm waiting for it, for you to give it to the detainees.
- 803 **Callum Tulley:** I think they must...who ordered those?
- 804 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: [inaudible] Juls
- 805 **Callum Tulley:** Juls?
- 806 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: He said to me—he has no idea. No idea what will happen or what's
- 807 been going on. That is not a football. That is not a football. I'm telling you.
- 808 **Callum Tulley:** Do you feel like the department is deteriorating?
- 809 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: I wondered why the coffee was a little bit bitter.
- 810 **Callum Tulley:** Do you feel like the department is deteriorating?
- 811 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: I feel bad, man. Yeah. I do feel like it is. Today, the guy came in
- here and says to me go clean the stuff in the gym. I had to get the bottle to spray, and the
- bottle is gone. Where has it gone to? It never happened when I was in charge. Where is the
- bottle? I have to look everywhere for the bottle, the bottle is gone. You know the big bottle to
- 815 do the floor?
- 816 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.
- 817 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** It's not there no more.
- 818 Callum Tulley: Ridiculous, man. I can't remember the last time there was a gym induction,
- 819 you know what I mean.
- 820 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** That's what I was thinking, too.
- 821 Callum Tulley: You know what I mean? When was the last time we had a gym induction?
- 822 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** They don't do gym inductions anymore.

- 823 **Callum Tulley:** Leave themselves liable, if they don't do gym inductions.
- 824 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: They do, yes. [inaudible] Nobody has done an induction in the
- gym for a long time now. They decided that they want to do whatever they want in that fucking
- gym, that's why it's all broken.
- 827 **Callum Tulley:** Who, the detainees?
- 828 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: I can't be bothered going to fight with them up there. What's the
- 829 point?
- 830 **Callum Tulley:** What are you going to do?
- Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: [Inaudible] they just [inaudible] they're banging the weights, that
- they don't know how to work out.
- 833 **Callum Tulley:** The thing is, well—I mean—do you think it's just like that in the gym?
- 834 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: I don't know, man. No gym induction, no control, no discipline,
- the cables are all damaged. All the cables are damaged now. I can see one of the cables
- 836 breaking up there, [inaudible]. Coming to repair the cables. Because believe it or not, I still
- care. I don't want to interfere too much, because after only [inaudible].
- 838 **Callum Tulley:** Do you feel like there's a lack of control here?
- 839 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: Like they care, they don't give a shit. What are they all do? All
- they do is sit in their offices and [inaudible], they go outside, they come back. They don't do
- much, do they? There's a lot of paperwork to be done, but it's just paperwork, innit? They're
- 842 used to using their fingers on their phones.
- 843 **Callum Tulley:** What do the SMT do? The senior managers?
- 844 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: I have no clue. Paperwork. But this is a job because we are here
- 845 to keep these people safe. The managers keep working on seeing how to keep them safe.
- [inaudible] They do things, you know. But it's not really a hard work job.

- 848 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: Our job is to keep the detainees occupied, to keep them busy, to

- what we're here for. Discipline, man, that's what it is. We're not [inaudible], you don't--do 10
- hours of work in here, it's not like you work in a factory and you make something, or you put

- you've done something. Here, you can't see what you've done.
- 855 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, there's nothing productive about the job.
- 856 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** Yeah, nothing productive about the job. We are just keeping safe,
- 857 keeping people in control, discipline—
- 858 **Callum Tulley:** Do you think that's why staff morale is quite low? Because they don't feel like—
- 859 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** Worthless. No, we aren't!
- 860 **Callum Tulley:** [laughter]

- 861 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: We are in a way—we're doing our jobs, but what I'm saying is that
- you don't make anything like the same goes to the hospital, you know. People go ill, they go
- to cure them and give them medicine and try to save them. Same thing. At the end of the day,
- the patient goes home, somebody—you've saved their life, or you've done something. In here,
- 865 we [inaudible] because people try to kill themselves and we try to stop them from doing silly
- 866 things.
- 867 **Callum Tulley:** True.
- 868 Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez: So, a lot of people are—
- 869 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, that's true, Ramon.
- 870 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** It's the job.
- 871 **Callum Tulley:** There are aspects to the job that can be rewarding do you know what I mean?

- they look after the passengers, they take them to another place and they're not producing

- 879 **Ramon Giraldo-Arbelaez:** Yeah, but we do this in the cell because [inaudible]

- 1056 **Rachel [Surname unknown Staff]:** Posh dude, really rich, really rich dude. He didn't need
- the money in here. He was just bored.

- 1059 Rachel [Surname unknown Staff]: He got left in in his first couple of weeks on C wing, on
- 1060 his own for about an hour on the wing.
- 1061 Callum Tulley: Wow.

- 1063 don't blame him for that.
- 1064 **Callum Tulley:** How many have left from your ITC already? Your training course?
- 1065 **Rachel [Surname unknown Staff]:** Four.

- 1067 **Rachel [Surname unknown Staff]:** Yeah, it's tough. It's such a shame, you know, because
