6 **Detainee 1:** Yeah.

7 **Male Officer 1:** But we're going to have to get a prescription.

8 **Male Officer 1:** But umm nurse called it, I didn't.

9 **Detainee 1:** Yeah. It's all right, he's just -

10 **Male Officer 1:** He's in so much pain with his tooth, we can't have him on [inaudible] he
11 can't take any more and he's got to have codeine.

12 **Unknown Male Speaker 1:** Codeine?

13 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Well, we tried to get some codeine this afternoon.

14 **Unknown Male Speaker 1:** The doctor couldn't prescribe it.

15 **D3988:** I can't wait, I can't wait, I can't wait [inaudible] I can't wait.

16 **Unknown Male Speaker 1:** [inaudible]

17 **Unknown Male Speaker 1:** He's got a toothache.

18 **Unknown Male Speaker 1:** Yeah, I know, I spoke to him yesterday. **D3988**. Right.

19 **Speakers cross-talking:** [inaudible].

20 **Male Officer 1:** Could everyone leave for a minute please.

21 **Callum Tulley:** All right, gents.

22 **Detainee 2:** [inaudible]

23 **Male Officer 1:** Just a minute guys, thank you.

24 **Male Officer 1:** Unfortunately. We'll get you back in in a minute.

25 **Callum Tulley:** You'll be back in.

26 **Male Officer 1:** Just everyone out at the moment.

27 **Speakers cross-talking:** [inaudible].

28 **Male Officer 1:** Let the guys out please

29 **Speakers cross-talking:** [inaudible].

30 **Unknown Male Speaker 2:** We'll open the door up again in a minute.

31 **Male Officer 1:** We'll open it again in a minute

32 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** [inaudible] taken some, he's taken paracetamol, I can't give him

33 anything stronger.

34 **Male Manager 1:** No, because yesterday they said to come up to [inaudible] and then speak

35 to- see the doctor see if they can actually give him, painkillers because the ibuprofen and

36 that's not doing anything.

37 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Yeah. [inaudible]

38 **Male Manager 1:** And I said, and we agreed that he would come back up.

39 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** But the doctor is not here at the moment.

40 **Male Manager 1:** No, but obviously when the doctor comes up, because obviously if they're

41 saying they could look at him, to see if he needs to go out on an emergency dental

42 appointment...

43 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Well, he obviously does, it's either, if he won't have got room to take

44 him today to then take him up to East Surrey.

45 **Male Manager 2:** Once it's left, once it's left, that's once it's left.

46 **Male Manager 1:** [inaudible in to radio set]

47 **Male voice coming through radio:** [inaudible] again

48 **Male Manager 1:** So if that's what they're saying, then obviously –

49 **Male Manager 1:** [inaudible in to radio set]

50 **Male voice coming through radio:** [inaudible]

51 **D3988** I can't wait, I can't wait, I can't wait, I can't wait.

52 **Male Manager 1:** Well, you can't have it both, you know, if they're saying they're all right for

53 us to take you, if one's out now, you at least have to wait for that to get back.

54 **D3988** How long roughly?

55 **Male Manager 1:** Well, when did it go?

56 **Male Manager 2:** It's just left.

57 **Male Manager 1:** It's just left. An hour, two hours. Kicking off, I told you yesterday, kicking
58 off's not going to do anything, is it?

59 **D3988:** I know, I'm in pain brother

60 **Male Manager 1:** What if the dentist doesn't do anything?

61 **D3988:** Huh?

62 **Male Manager 1:** You know, [inaudible] still take you, and they look at it.

63 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** They'll probably start him on antibiotics or something.

64 **Male Manager 1:** But then again, you're still going to have to wait for those to work.

65 **D3988:** But whatever it is, something needs to be done. I can't do this no more.

66 **Male Manager 1:** Well, if healthcare are happy for you to go out, then obviously you can go.

67 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Well, it's the only thing I can think of, I mean...

68 **Unknown female staff member 1:** Craig-

69 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Yeah.

70 **Unknown female staff member 1:** The dental clinic's not open, it's only, it's done by
71 appointment only.

72 **Unknown Male Speaker 3:** [inaudible]

73 **Unknown female staff member 1:** Dental clinic will not be open, it's only done by
74 appointment.

75 **Unknown Male Speaker 3:** [inaudible]

76 **Unknown female staff member 1:** Yeah.

77 **Unknown Male Speaker 3:** [inaudible]

78 **Unknown female staff member 1:** If they've got an appointment it'll be arranged with the
79 dentist [inaudible].

80 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Phone them up and see if they can see if they can see somebody
81 there

82 **Unknown Male Speaker 4:** if they can fit him in as an emergency.

83 **Speakers cross-talking:** [inaudible]

84 **Male Manager 1:** **D3988** take a seat, they're trying to work out what to do, all right? Take
85 a seat or not?

86 **D3988:** All right, all right, all right.

87 **Male Manager 1:** But listen, this is what I'm saying to you, isn't it? I get you're in pain, but
88 coming here every day and doing this, it, like, even if they say –

89 **Callum Tulley:** Do you want a hand with that?

90 **Male Manager 1:** They're trying to cancel the second escort for you to go, but then
91 [inaudible] turn around and say no it's appointment only, you can't just rock up, then again
92 we have to go through a different process [inaudible] you're not going to go out [inaudible]
93 **D3988:** [inaudible] in serious pain [inaudible] I wouldn't be acting out but I'm in serious
94 pain.

95 **Male Manager 1:** No but obviously I get that, but obviously we're bound by what the
96 hospital say. We don't, just because you're in pain, if the hospital say no, they have to be
97 referred or whatever, then there's nothing we can do. All we can do is look to get you
98 referred sooner rather than later.

99 **D3988:** I can't do another night, I can't.

100 **Male Manager 1:** Huh?

101 **D3988:** I can't do another night.

102 **Male Manager 1:** Well no, but then obviously the doctor's in as well, like I said to you
103 yesterday, when you did this. Didn't I? You do this all the time, and the doctor comes in, the
104 doctor might prescribe you different, stronger painkillers, codeine or whatever. But again,
105 you're not going to take two codeine and feel better are you? You've got to wait for it to go in
106 your system and work.

107 **D3988:** I've taken dozens of paracetamol and ibuprofens, it doesn't work.

108 **Male Manager 1:** Well yeah but again, when did you start taking it? You took it yesterday
109 and you've not taken it –

110 **D3988:** Nah I've been taking them for the last few days.

111 **Male Manager 1:** But you're not taking it properly, you're taking four, five in one hit, or
112 whatever you're saying you're doing. You're not staggering anything, do you know what I
113 mean?

114 **Unknown Male Speaker 5:** You should do two every four hours, a couple of times, let it
115 build it up, doing a big gulp in one go ain't going to –

116 **Male Manager 1:** Doesn't do nothing. But it's like I said to you, we can go through this
117 every day, every healthcare time, but ultimately what's gonna change?

118 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Can I have your card?

119 **Male Manager 1:** All you're going to do is end up getting yourself in trouble and your
120 [inaudible]

121 **D3988:** [inaudible]

122 **Male Manager 1:** Well of course you do because you're going to get yourself in trouble, and
123 you're not going to get [inaudible] result, because you're still going to be in exactly the same
124 pain as you are. So if you end up on the wing, if you end up down the block, you're still
125 going to be in as much pain as you are now. But if you stop kicking off and you talk to
126 people, I told you what to do, and 12 hours on I'm back here having the same conversation
127 with you. Aren't I? Wait and see what the doctor says.

128 **Male Nurse 1 "Craig":** Do we know the name of the guy that's got the second appointment?

129 **Male Officer 2:** [inaudible]
130 **Speakers cross-talking:** [inaudible] [laughs]
131 **Unknown Male Speaker 6:** [inaudible]
132 **Unknown Male Speaker 7:** 596 is in the office.

178 doorway and greets some of them]

180 **Ryan Bromley:** – it's like the other day, you know the courtyard. I got punched in the back
181 of the head a few times –

182 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

183 **Ryan Bromley:** Didn't come in the next day. Then when I got in at half three in the morning–

184 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

185 **Ryan Bromley:** It went down as sickness.

186 **Callum Tulley:** No way.

187 **Ryan Bromley:** It went down as sickness, and then I found out–

188 **Callum Tulley:** So you er- what time did you leave here?

189 **Ryan Bromley:** I got – I che- I clocked out at quarter past two in the morning.

190 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

191 **Ryan Bromley:** Home for three, and then I got that done to me. [someone knocks against the
192 door they are leaning against] And then it happened to umm –

193 **Callum Tulley:** Sarah was saying to me the other day, like the support she's had from senior
194 management has been shocking.

195 **Ryan Bromley:** Yeah, exactly it is.

196 **Detainee:** [inaudible while showing ID]

197 **Ryan Bromley:** Yes, all good. This is- they don't back you up mate. It's like [inaudible], how
198 long's Babs been here?

199 **Callum Tulley:** I know he's been here about seven years.

200 **Ryan Bromley:** Yeah, he's just been suspended with his salary. That must be something –

201 **Callum Tulley:** I wonder what they did.

202 **Ryan Bromley:** Thinking about it, it must be something them three have done –

203 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

204 **Ryan Bromley:** Together

205 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

206 **Ryan Bromley:** Cause I don't ever work with [inaudible]

207 **Callum Tulley:** No.

208 **Ryan Bromley:** She works in B-wing, but, it's a bit racist though, isn't it?

209 **Callum Tulley:** It doesn't look good really.

210 **Ryan Bromley:** No, sacking the only three black officers we've got.

211 **Callum Tulley:** I know.

212 **Ryan Bromley:** No, it's...

213 **Callum Tulley:** The workforce in this place isn't diverse enough.

214 **Ryan Bromley:** No, that's what I'm saying. It's not that, it's just the fact that when Tinsy
215 goes there's gonna be literally [inaudible]

216 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, nah, but it doesn't look good when everyone's a white male.

217 **Ryan Bromley:** No, exactly.

218 **Callum Tulley:** and like we're banging up like a load of black dudes, do you know what I
219 mean?

220 **Ryan Bromley:** Yeah, yeah. That's what I'm saying. I think – I don't know, I think it was to
221 do with something that Babs' done. **DX** you all right man?

222 **Detainee 2:** Yeah, yeah, yeah.

223 **Ryan Bromley:** Something that Babs' done, he done [steps through doorway] I think Babs
224 had a massive argument with **D119** [?]

225 **Callum Tulley:** He what?

226 **Ryan Bromley:** Had a massive argument with **D119** [inaudible] the other day.

227 **Callum Tulley:** Oh right.

228 **Ryan Bromley:** And it was upstairs with [inaudible]

229 **Callum Tulley:** **D119** is he that Somalian? [inaudible]

230 **Ryan Bromley:** Yeah.

231 **Callum Tulley:** [inaudible] just lary isn't he?

232 **Ryan Bromley:** Yeah, they had a massive argument, and I think it's to do with that. Because
233 I was sitting up doing my report and [inaudible] and then I heard Jules say umm "Get Babs
234 up here now," to someone.

249 **Callum Tulley:** Really?

250 **Female Officer 1:** [inaudible] under investigation.

251 **Callum Tulley:** No way. What – what are they investigating you for?

252 **Female Officer 1:** Something I did on nights that – it's stupid. I'm going to be redeployed

253 during the investigation.

254 **Callum Tulley:** You'll be redeployed to the unit? What did you do on nights, if I may ask?

255 **Female Officer 1:** There were a load of factors that [inaudible] as [inaudible]. I had cleaners

256 out anyway, giving out paracetamol and giving out faxes at the same time. I didn't leave the

257 doors open, but the fact I went, around opened the doors, gave it to them, then shut the doors–

258 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, during the night, when they sh–

259 **Female Officer 1:** But how – you know it's [inaudible] paracetamol.

260 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, well, I suppose paracetamol is like um medical issue, isn't it?

261 **Female Officer 1:** Yeah, but it's, you're still opening the doors.

262 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

263 **Female Officer 1:** And if they want two members of staff there then they need to stop

264 putting us on constants when there's three people sat down eating doing fuck all, leaving us

265 over two wings. Because that happened on the same night.

266 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, so there was just one of you to a wing, on your nights.

267 **Female Officer 1:** Umm for an hour, so we were covering [inaudible]. The thing that pisses

268 me off is that they're pulling me off for this, not particularly concerned about the guy that

269 pulled me in the office [inaudible] the SIR [inaudible] for pulling me in the office by my wrist,

270 and then they've looked at the rest of the camera footage to see if I've antagonised him in

271 any way. [snorts] But [inaudible]

272 **Male Officer 1:** So according to them how are you meant to give the faxes during the night

273 shift?

274 **Female Officer 1:** Well, we're not meant to give them during the night, but if they –

275 **Male Officer 1:** You keep it to the morning?

276 **Callum Tulley:** Could you know have put it under the door, the cell door? Just slid it under?

277 **Female Officer 1:** The problem with that is you don't know the right person's getting it.

278 Someone could take their fax and then they'd say there was no [inaudible]

279 **Callum Tulley:** Sure. Yeah, that's fair enough. Yeah, that's fair enough.

280 **Male Officer 1:** Callum–

281 **Callum Tulley:** How are you doing Daneesh. Are you all right?

282 **Female Officer 1:** Do you know who that is?

283 **Callum Tulley:** Who?

284 **Female Officer 1:** D2150

285 **Callum Tulley:** Who?

286 **Female Officer 1:** D2150 The one who's got an issue with me.

287 **Callum Tulley:** Oh really?

288 **Male Officer 1:** Did you see him?

289 **Female Officer 1:** I don't know. [inaudible]

290 **Male Officer 1:** Yeah, you must have, you must have. Did you ask for the pictures?

291 **Female Officer 1:** Yeah.

292 **Callum Tulley:** So when the guy pulled you into the wing office was there any consequences
293 for his actions or –

294 **Female Officer 1:** No, he's still got his job. Because it was in the office, you can't see it.

295 **Callum Tulley:** Oh right.

296 **Female Officer 1:** The only thing you can see is me come out and my hand hit the side as
297 I've gone back in. That's the only way they can see that I've not –

298 **Callum Tulley:** So what did he do? Did he literally just –

299 **Female Officer 1:** Grabbed me by my wrist, but he got my watch.

300 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, right.

301 **Female Officer 1:** Because he got my watch I was able to pull my wrist down [gestures
302 pulling her wrist down], and it was basically a "Get the fuck off me," he did.

303 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

304 **Female Officer 1:** I didn't hit him, I didn't call first response, because he got off me.

305 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

306 **Female Officer 1:** It's, he's had his one chance and blown it, if he comes near me again,
307 then he's going to have issues and be down the block, probably with a black eye. But I took
308 the judgement of, no I'm not going to hit him, he got off me, he followed me upstairs, err but
309 he went in the room.

310 **Callum Tulley:** Did he umm – did, right.

311 **Female Officer 1:** I had a slight nail indent.

312 **Callum Tulley:** But did they not take your word against, did the senior management not take
313 your word against his?

314 **Female Officer 1:** He's been made a risk to women and children. Because even he said, you
315 know, there's no cameras in here, what are you going to do? I said to Trig, look all of this, I
316 was asking for my pen. And then that was like, do you know what, fuck it, I'm going to go
317 put DX in this room cause he was cleaning. As I've walked out of the office, he's

318 grabbed my wrist and pulled me in. He's still got my pen, you know, and he's gone up and
319 spoken to him, put my pen back, and said: "I haven't touched her." You can see me go just
320 about go back in, and the fact he had my pen, there's some truth to what I'm saying.

321 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

322 **Female Officer 1:** But they've made him a risk to everything but cause you can't see it –

323 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, so they've made him a risk to women and children as a consequence of
324 what he did to you.

325 **Female Officer 1:** Yeah. Yeah.

326 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, all right.

327 **Female Officer 1:** They pulled me off. And now they've put another female member of staff
328 down there. Cause that's what we originally thought it was, that –

329 **Callum Tulley:** So, oh, all right.

330 **Female Officer 1:** It's because they've looked at the footage from earlier on in the night,
331 seen me open doors.

332 **Callum Tulley:** How many of you were down there?

333 **Female Officer 1:** What?

334 **Callum Tulley:** What- which one was, which wing was this?

335 **Female Officer 1:** Huh?

336 **Callum Tulley:** Which wing was this?

337 **Female Officer 1:** Charlie. There's only one on each wing during the night.

338 **Callum Tulley:** Really?

339 **Female Officer 1:** Yeah. And then-

340 **Callum Tulley:** Wow.

341 **Female Officer 1:** when Ryan went to do his constant, I was covering both wings for an
342 hour. And the same with him and me, whilst there's three of them sat in E-wing in the office
343 doing fuck all. Yeah, so I'm more concerned about the guy pulling me in the office, not me
344 opening a door that I was able to shut because someone wanted their fax. [inaudible].

345 **Callum Tulley:** I'm surprised they, I'm surprised you got, you've been like actually
346 investigated for, for the something. I know, I know it's, I suppose it's because it's just a fax,
347 it is, it's a bit of a security breach, isn't it?

348 **Female Officer 1:** Everyone does it though.

349 **Callum Tulley:** Do they? I mean I don't work nights so I don't know.

350 **Female Officer 1:** Everyone on nights opens the doors. I mean I've had people leave doors
351 open on me. That night I'd had someone come up and say: "Oh are you not going to lock me
352 in." [inaudible] they should have done it.

353 **Callum Tulley:** Do you think someone grassed you up?

354 **Female Officer 1:** I... the harder I try doing my job, the more things that explode. And, you
355 know, I've had people spread shit about me that's complete bullshit, just because they want
356 to get higher up. So I don't really know.

357 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

358 **Female Officer 1:** All I know is that I've spoken to Ian McDonald, I've spoken to Dixie, I've
359 spoken to Anne, I'm going to speak to Trotty because he's the [inaudible] ASSA member rep.
360 I'll ask him to sit in on my interview. Umm but all of them have said, you know, it's no
361 different to giving out paracetamol, there was another incident that happened, you know, I've
362 always said that, there's, I've more risk during the day, when there's more officers, because,
363 busy wing, you know, if we're going up to talk to people to see what's going on, to do random
364 checks –

365 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

366 **Female Officer 1:** I could be pulled in a wing and they wouldn't know till lunchtime.

367 **Callum Tulley:** It's mad. No, I mean like fair play to you for trying to do your job, like best
368 you can. Like, when I first started working here I was the same, like I was quite, like, I did
369 try and do everything like literally to like the way I felt was best for the centre. But I sort of
370 realised that, you just can't change this place, you just can't change this place. And if you
371 ask Ben, if you ask Ben or anyone who's been here since the very start, for seven years,
372 they'll say the same thing, you know, they've, it's like, it's really frustrating, it's hard to like,
373 when you get to that point and you realise, you can't, or I realised anyway that there was
374 nothing that I could do to sort of change this place.

375 **Female Officer 1:** I love my job. Anyone who works with me knows I love my job. I could
376 have been signed off for an extra three weeks sick, injured, but I went no, I want to come
377 back to work.

378 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

379 **Female Officer 1:** And now I wish I'd taken it because this has happened. But, [inaudible]
380 someone said to me, that you'll notice it's the ones who care who get suspended.

381 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

382 **Female Officer 1:** Who get sacked.

383 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

384 **Female Officer 1:** It's the ones who just sort of move along doing it that are still there.

385 **Callum Tulley:** And then you've got a choice to make, haven't you?

386 **Female Officer 1:** Do you stop caring or do you find another job?

387 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

388 **Male Officer 1:** [inaudible]

389 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, no worries bud. I'll get- I'll let them know.

390 **Female Officer 1:** Yeah, no, he's a dickhead.

391 **Callum Tulley:** What the guy who's going an escort? Who is he?

392 **Female Officer 1:** Uh, **D2150** he's been put down the block. But he's been put on the
393 risk to women and children for being infatuated with one particular member of staff.

394 **Callum Tulley:** Oh really?

395 **Female Officer 1:** He's the one [inaudible] turned around and said, you cannot dictate who
396 bangs you up, and he refused to bang up unless I went down.

397 **Callum Tulley:** Oh really?

398 **Female Officer 1:** He kept giving me little – I'm tempted to say love notes, but they made
399 no fucking sense.

400 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

401 **Female Officer 1:** Umm and he got put down the block, then got put on [inaudible] wing,
402 and then went down the block again, it's the one who doesn't shower, but you'll notice when I
403 walk in E-wing, he was playing chess with Yan.

404 **Callum Tulley:** Oh, mate I've got to turn that shit off, sorry. [walks over and turns down
405 radio] Oh, I think I might know who you're talking about.

406 **Female Officer 1:** He was playing chess with Yan.

407 **Callum Tulley:** Eh?

408 **Female Officer 1:** And I walked in, he stood up, walked to his room, slammed his door, and
409 then he thought I'd gone cause I was in the office –

410 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah.

411 **Female Officer 1:** He came and sat down and as I walked out he slow clapped until I left.

412 **Callum Tulley:** Wow.
