Callum Tulley: That's what I don't really understand is that like you – they didn't give you the opportunity to go and put your stuff in your locker, like you normally would. So you bring your mobile phone into the – through the gate house, you put it into your locker, but they didn't – they didn't let us go around the lockers. I mean I was lucky because I didn't have a phone. I didn't have my phone on me yesterday, so I was just about – if I would have gone – when I walked to the lockers, Steve Skitt was like, 'Oh no, don't worry Callum.Don't go to the lockers, just keep going through up to visits.' And I was just thinking, well, I would - I would normally put my phone in my locker, and then if I go up to visits and bring my mobile phone, and then I'm sort of – do you know what I mean?

288 Anya [Surname unknown - Officer]: And then my argument is, well what she's saying is it's 289 because you don't have a locker, so because I'm one of the new people, I haven't been 290 assigned a locker. Like people that have been here for years, and they don't have a locker.

291 Adel Hinder: Yeah. I don't. Yeah.

292 Anya [Surname unknown - Officer]: But what I do, is usually I will ask gate house, they have 293 the little lockers by the radios and stuff, but you have to be - what I do, I put my stuff, and 294 then I'll go to the gate house, I'll ask for a key, and then I'll put this stuff in the locker, in the 295 end of the day I'll hand it back here, you know. Oh yeah, because you don't have a locker 296 assigned, I'll have to assume you were going to take it in. You didn't let me go to my fucking 297 locker. You didn't even let me ask for a key. How does that make sense?

298 Adel Hinder: Was it - why didn't you say to her?
