Detainee 1: Just I want to get some form and to fill it out, from Home Office. But where I can get?

Callum Tulley: Library. When the association begins at half one, you go to the library and - I'll give you one, I'll be there.

Darren Thomsett: And I just thought, what did you do, did you bottle this all up and think about this overnight, and then when we come in the morning, you want to come in here and have a fucking little dig [inaudible], you know what I mean? You know, fuck off. And he went to me, 'I spent time in prison, I know what prison is like, I don't want to be here. I don't [inaudible] - I shouldn't be in here. I should be in prison'. I was thinking, you were. I said, 'why did you go to prison?' And I said, 'you fucking got caught, didn't you?' I said, 'that's why you end up in prison because you got caught'. And I said, 'now you're in here because you've got to sort your immigration case out'. You see, somewhere along the line, you have to think about what you're doing, yeah, and somehow, you know, start thinking a little bit. Cos' obviously on the outside you couldn't cope, and he starts with this. Clearly you're not coping outside. Because you go out, commit crime, you're going to prison, now you're coming in here. You're moaning that you're being detained. Well fucking stop getting detained? This is, you know, this is their lives just going round in one little vicious circle. The police, get arrested, the police station, court, prison. Back out, police station, court. You don't stop. You just keep going around. But that was it, yeah. Yesterday morning was just, this morning they've been a, little bit better [inaudible]. You see, the trouble we've got is that we've been trying to run this as an induction wing so all these new people, none of them are picking up any good habits or decent habits because we've got at least 10 single occupants [inaudible], alright, and you're pushing drugs. Maybe they are but whichever way you look at it, [inaudible] pushing drugs, and they will be using drugs.

Callum Tulley: I only shake my head because if they're pushing drugs in the induction wing then what hope has the place got.

Darren Thomsett: It's - no, yeah. Dude, it's happening. I have seen yesterday. I mean yesterday evening, after dinner, I promise you this, right, it was like the walking dead in here. Alright, everyone was zombied out. They were walking around all stoned of their nut, whether it's with spice, weed, whatever. It doesn't matter. But they're all, you know. I can - I can go to you, him, him, him, him, him. I've got about 10, 12 people. I've got 10 12 names. Most of them are single occupants. So they're the bad, that's the bad influences. So they see people wondering doing what they're doing on this wing, but they think it's alright on the other wings. So if they're trying at least to set them a good example in here of this is what we do and this is what we don't do, at least when they try and go to the other wings, they should hopefully take some back with them, you know, just a little bit. You know even if it's just a please and thank you. It's better than nothing.

Callum Tulley: Absolutely.

135 **Darren Thomsett:** It's just something. Just take something [inaudible].
136 **Callum Tulley:** I agree with you.
137 **Darren Thomsett:** You understand what the regime is, and take it with you. You know,
138 you say please and thank you when you get [inaudible]. You know what I mean? Just the
139 little things. But eventually over time, and it takes a long time but over time, it will be a
140 better centre but it takes time. Its – you know, I ain't fucking – we ain't never going to
141 solve things overnight when we're looking at a couple of months.

186 office so he can make the phone calls that he needs to make. His words were, 'I've got a
187 phone call I need to make.' Alright, no. What are you talking about?

189 **Darren Thomsett:** Well that's what I told him. I said I'm not fucking taking you through

Ryan Bromley: Well the thing is, it was like half way through my fourth [inaudible] day and I was first response. I shouldn't have [inaudible] to be fair, but you've got to ain't you.

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460 **Callum Tulley:** And can – and can – and can push someone away. That's –
461 **Male Officer 1:** Yeah. Push.
462 **Female Officer 1:** Poor Dixie.
463 **Male Officer 1:** But he's got a mark by the sounds of it he's grabbed him.
464 **Callum Tulley:** What's he – what's he done? What's actually happened, sorry? I walked
465 out when you he was saying that.
466 **Female Officer 1:** But he should have reported.
467 **Male Officer 1:** He walked on the wing, and basically he grabbed him and he's got a
468 mark on his arm [inaudible] here.
469 **Male Officer 2:** That's a load of bollocks, you bunch of pussies, give it the big one, and
470 then the mark and they'll complain. That's a fucking joke.
471 **Female Officer 1:** He didn't even know he was marked until we started walking down,
472 and he went, 'Oh look. [Inaudible] has marked my arm.' And he has got a mark.
473 **Callum Tulley:** What sort of mark is it?
474 **Female Officer 1:** Like somebody has – [mimics someone grabbing top of her arm].
475 **Male Officer 1:** At the end of the day, Graham you know, you know better. You
476 should know better than not to grab someone in a place like this.
477 **Callum Tulley:** What you mean? Yeah. Yeah. You shouldn't. Yeah.
478 **Male Officer 1:** You don't go around grabbing people. Not when everyone is on about
479 you've got to cover your ass all the time. You can't start going grabbing people up.
480 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah. It's true. Do you reckon he'll get disciplined for that?
481 **Male Officer 1:** Yeah, he'll get in trouble for that, especially if he puts in a report.
482 Because they'll watch the CCTV of it. I know on CCTV you can't hear anything, so what it
483 will look like is he walked past and Graham just grabbed him. So it'll look [inaudible].
484 **Female Officer 1:** He knows how to play it.
485 **Callum Tulley:** Graham.
486 **Female Officer 1:** He knows how to play it, these guys are [inaudible].
487 **Callum Tulley:** It's a new Graham, isn't it?
488 **Male Officer 1:** Yeah, he's fairly new. He's normally on B wing.
489 **Callum Tulley:** Black hair? Black hair?
490 **Male Officer 1:** Yeah. Yeah. He's got black hair, yeah.
491 **Female Officer 1:** These guys are not stupid though, they know.
492 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah [inaudible] right.
493 **Female Officer 1:** Yeah, he's alright.
494 **Callum Tulley:** But he shouldn't – that detainee well he shouldn't – like he wasn't –
495 that's not his wing is it?
496 **Female Officer 1:** No. Apparently he went on the wing yesterday that he was on, to use
497 a fax machine, and he was really arsey with him then. And then today, he went to go on
498 A wing, and I think he was winding him up more than anything. Because he said he went
499 in there to look for someone, and then Graham practically wrapped him up to get him
500 out. Tried to wrap his arm up to get him out.
501 **Male Officer 1:** [Inaudible] has been suspended for talking to a detainee badly. So if
502 he's on camera grabbing one, trying to wrestle him off the wing.
503 **Female Officer 1:** Well I felt bad because –
504 **Male Officer 1:** He's on probation.
505 **Female Officer 1:** Because I felt bad, because it was like [inaudible].
506 **Callum Tulley:** Silly sausage.
507 **Female Officer 1:** And I went around because he was raising his voice and all that.
508 Then I walked back down and he said about the mark. So I had to then go over – I went
509 and spoke to [inaudible] because I couldn't find Dean, and I said, 'Look, Dean knows
510 about it.' I said I just wanted to stay out of it. I said, but at the end of the day he told
511 me and I've seen it, and he is going to complain, and he's writing a complaint letter now,
512 he showed me.
513 **Callum Tulley:** Who? **D720** is?

514 **Female Officer 1:** [D720] yeah.
515 **Callum Tulley:** Well then, there we go.
516 **Male Officer 1:** See you later Graham.
517 **Female Officer 1:** I think these detainees once they take a disliking to you. Did you sort
518 out [inaudible].
519 **Callum Tulley:** Some of them. Some of them. But there's others who wouldn't – who
520 are – I'm not going to
521 lie, they actually are not that bad.
522 **Male Officer 1:** Did you go down to E wing?
523 **Callum Tulley:** Some – yeah, he went down there earlier and he apologised to me.
524 **Female Officer 1:** He did actually.
525 **Male Officer 2:** What was that?
526 **Female Officer 1:** Don't know what that was.
527 **Callum Tulley:** Do you know what I mean, like that little guy you used to love Dan.
528 Little Chinese man. If you – if you grabbed his arm, because he was trying to come onto
529 the wing, and he says, no, you can't come on, he wouldn't.
530 **Male Officer 1:** Yeah. [Inaudible].
531 **Callum Tulley:** He just wouldn't. You just shouldn't grab people.
532 **Male Officer 1:** You know better. Especially in a place like this.
533 **Male Officer 2:** So then you leave them on [inaudible].
534 **Male Officer 1:** If you – you have to just ask them. If they point blank refuse, you call
535 the manager.
536 **Male Officer 1:** It's just the rules, isn't it?
537 **Female Officer 1:** You can't touch them.
538 **Male Officer 1:** You can't [inaudible].
539 **Female Officer 1:** Unless they're coming at you, then it's personal space. You know,
540 I've done it before when a guy is being really close to me, and I'm like, 'No, back off.'
541 I've done that.
542 **Male Officer 1:** Obviously everyone would want to just grab them and throw them off
543 the wing, but rules are rules, and rules [inaudible].
544 **Callum Tulley:** They shouldn't be allowed to just come on the wing though, because
545 there's never any repercussions for them.
546 **Male Officer 1:** No. [Inaudible].
547 **Callum Tulley:** Because that [D720] is used to doing that. That's why he just barges
548 straight past people. He's tried to do it to me in the past.
549 **Male Officer 1:** The best you can do is you let them on, report it to the manager of that
550 wing, so if you say C wing, tell [inaudible] keeps coming on the wing, won't get off. It's
551 out of your hands then.
552 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah, but Dan, do you think [inaudible] is going to do much?
553 **Female Officer 1:** I've been on the wing.
554 **Male Officer 1:** No but what are you going to do? He's got more power than you have.
555 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah. True.
556 **Female Officer 1:** I've been on a wing where they've radioed and said there's a
557 detainee
558 on your wing that shouldn't be on there, and it's like --
559 **Male Officer 1:** What do you want me to do?
560 **Female Officer 1:** – yeah.
561 **Callum Tulley:** It's easy for you to say that, up in control, isn't it?
562 **Female Officer 1:** – Exactly. [Inaudible] you go to a wing, and you're letting off people
563 that aren't even on that wing.
564 **Male Officer 1:** We should be allowed to just, you know, get them off.
565 **Callum Tulley:** I was on – you know that first response yesterday I was called to
566 healthcare for that fight, well no
567 for that guy kicking off, and then that little fight happened between them two
568 detainees. I was on C wing earlier, and one of the guys on D – one of the guys was
569 meant to be on D wing, one of them meant to be on C wing, and the guy who was meant
570 to be on D wing was actually on C wing this afternoon.

571 **Male Officer 1:** Yeah.
572 **Callum Tulley:** It's not good really.
573 **Male Officer 1:** This is a hard rule to stick to, keeping them off the wing.
574 **Callum Tulley:** They never used to do it. It's – I'm sorry, I'll start saying things I
575 shouldn't, but it's since the new – I'm not going to lie, just based on my experience,
576 since the new staff come in, that is completely just like – completely happened. It didn't
577 use to be like that. They – you used to see someone smoking on the top landing and the
578 detainee clocks that you saw him smoking, he'd scurry back into his room. Now you're
579 lucky if they don't blow it in your face and you go, he's going to stick a finger up at you
580 or something.
581 **Male Officer 2:** Yeah. Yeah.
582 **Callum Tulley:** That's what happened to me with [inaudible], do you remember that? I
583 couldn't believe it.
584 **Male Officer 2:** What happened?
585 **Callum Tulley:** I couldn't believe it. But once, this Polish detainee, called [inaudible] he
586 was smoking on top landing and I go, 'What are you doing? You can't smoke on the
587 landing'. He blew it in my face, and he goes like that. I couldn't believe it. I could not
588 believe it.
589 **Male Officer 2:** Oh shit.
590 **Female Officer 1:** And what did you do?
591 **Callum Tulley:** I started – I went downstairs, went to the C wing office, started writing
592 the detainee out a warning. He came into the office, saw that I was writing him out a
593 warning, realized that he was going to – this – one in a million time he was actually
594 going to get in trouble for smoking. So he started kicking off, tried to attack me, crazy,
595 and what's his name, he's down there, Mark Brewster, got in between me and him, and
596 basically prevented it, then I had the SAR, and he ended up getting taken to the block by
597 force, and then shipped out to somewhere else.
598 **Male Officer 1:** You're causing agro in here.
599 **Male Officer 1:** He does, doesn't he?
600 **Callum Tulley:** I couldn't believe it.
601 **Male Officer 1:** You took on some [inaudible].
602 **Callum Tulley:** It's because I'm doing my job properly mate.
603 **Male Officer 1:** I can't believe [inaudible].
604 **Callum Tulley:** If someone is smoking, challenge them. If someone takes your keys,
605 challenge them.
606 **Male Officer 2:** I can't believe that.
607 **Callum Tulley:** That's what we're meant to do. That's what [inaudible].
608 **Male Officer 1:** If someone pushed past you on the wing.
609 **Callum Tulley:** I wouldn't grab at them. God no, because you're not allowed to do that.
610 I'd only do things you're allowed to do, obviously.
611 **Male Officer 1:** But [inaudible].
612 **Callum Tulley:** But what I do is when I – what I do is I don't – I don't – I wouldn't let
613 them on the wing though, because what I do is I open the door. When I open the door to
614 the wing, I do this. Open it, and stand in the door way, like that, so they can't actually
615 get past you. They physically can't do it, unless they push you, or do something to you,
616 in which case you are entitled to not grab him, but just – it's your personal space. If
617 someone enters your personal space –
618 **Male Officer 2:** But they can't see that on camera, can they?
619 **Male Officer 1:** That's the problem.
620 **Male Officer 2:** The bit [inaudible] between the door, they cannot see you. They'll just
621 see him grabbing him from a distance [inaudible] because that door [inaudible].
622 **Callum Tulley:** No. But I'm not saying grab someone. I wouldn't do that. I wouldn't do
623 that. But if someone –
624 **Male Officer 2:** No. No. But what I'm saying is they can't see that bit when they're on
625 the camera. You're at [inaudible] very door is, the door is open.
626 **Male Officer 1:** Not from inside the room but they can from the corridor.
627 **Male Officer 2:** What's that?

628 **Female Officer 1:** But even if they pushed past you, and they walked off, it doesn't
629 then give you the right to grab them. Because they still –
630 **Callum Tulley:** Oh no. Absolutely not.
631 **Female Officer 1:** – they're still not hurting you. The only time you can touch them is if
632 they physically touch you.
633 **Male Officer 1:** So, the best way, and like I said the best you can do is either try to talk
634 them off the wing or report it.
635 **Female Officer 1:** Yeah.
636 **Male Officer 1:** That's all you can do. Other than that, you can't do anything. Unless
637 you – like I say you get a manager down; I know the manager might not do anything,
638 but they've got authority to say –
639 **Callum Tulley:** Yeah. Nice and easy.
640 **Male Officer 1:** When there is three of you, you can take them off.
