507 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** That's fine.
508 [D149]: If I ever seen you get beaten up in the street I will walk past and I
509 will let it go on.
510 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** Alright
511 [D149]: 100 percent.
512 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** Okay.
513 [D149]: 100 percent. And if I see anyone, anyone, I walk past. Do you know
514 why? Cause you wasn't there for me when I fucking needed help.
515 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** I called healthcare for you.
516 [D149]: Healthcare?
517 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** Yeah.
518 [D149]: How long did it take them to come here?
519 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** That's not down to me. I can't make
520 them come any quicker.
521 [D149]: Then you tried to come in my room talk about my fucking mum.
522 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** I come in, I come down to make
523 sure you was alright.
524 [D149]: Yeah sure you did, come on. Stop chatting [inaudible].
525 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** Did I not come and sit on your chair
526 next to you?
527 [D149]: You, he wasn't here, he wasn't here. I [inaudible]. It was you.
528 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** Yeah we were sat there on the
529 computer chairs -
530 [D149]: Listen, listen, listen.
531 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** - and we were talking.
532 [D149]: Let me tell you, let me tell you. I'm not arguing, I'm talking init.
533 **Callum Tulley:** Sorry.

534 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** Alright.
 535 [D149] There was you, there was I don't know what this thing is here
 536 anyway. You know what I'm saying?
 537 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** What? [Points to Callum]
 538 [D149]: No this [Points to Female Officer 1]
 539 **Female Officer 1:** What, me?
 540 [D149]: Yeah.
 541 **Female Officer 1:** Why you starting on me for?
 542 [D149]: Cause you was there laughing as well.
 543 **Female Officer 1:** What do you mean I was laughing. I was just passing though.
 544 [D149]: So if I get security [inaudible] look and see the camera, you wasn't
 545 there [inaudible].
 546 **Female Officer 1:** Look I was passing through.
 547 [D149]: So, listen -
 548 **Female Officer 1:** You said you was gonna be sick, I put a bin there, then I carried on
 549 passing. So that's it, that's all I done. I don't even know what the story was. I didn't
 550 know nothing. You said you were going to be sick and I [inaudible].
 551 **Callum Tulley:** What happened, what actually happened [D149]
 552 [D149]: Listen bro, I tell you. I went outside yeah, I got high init. I came back
 553 in. I froze and -
 554 **Callum Tulley:** You shouldn't have been smoking [D149]
 555 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** You just said you didn't take
 556 anything and that you were sick.
 557 [D149]: Listen, you gonna listen or not? You gonna listen, no you're not.
 558 You're just laughing. I went outside, I smoked 4 spliffs yeah, 4 that's it. I came back I
 559 started to walk. I felt unwell. I came in here and they was taking the piss. So now they
 560 are saying I can't go out no more. She made that decision.
 561 **Callum Tulley:** Well, because you've gone out smoking drugs [D149], that's why mate.
 562 [D149]: Its only drugs bro, not like I'm doing cocaine.
 563 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** But its illegal in here.
 564 [D149]: How is it illegal? [Inaudible].
 565 **Female Officer 1:** You couldn't stand anymore and you were going to be sick.
 566 **Callum Tulley:** You're not allowed to do that in here in this centre [D149] you know
 567 that mate.
 568 [D149]: I know, I went to Colnbrook [inaudible] you know what bro, in a
 569 matter of seconds [inaudible] officers, managers were there for me, managers were
 570 there for me, managers, managers. And you know what?
 571 [Ryan Bromley enters office]
 572 **Ryan Bromley:** [Inaudible] good?
 573 **Callum Tulley:** All good, yeah – ish.
 574 [D149] I don't trust these G4S so I want to transfer to [inaudible] that's it.
 575 **Callum Tulley:** Fill out a transfer request form.
 576 [D149]: No I don't have to bro, I just assault immigration that's it.
 577 **Callum Tulley:** How you gonna transfer then?
 578 [D149]: Tell them to do it.
 579 **Ryan Bromley:** [Inaudible] you won't if you assault them and it'll be in their report
 580 [inaudible].
 581 **Callum Tulley:** Certainly don't think it's a good idea to start assaulting people.
 582 [D149]: It's not good bro, I know it's not. Do you think I feel good about it?
 583 **Callum Tulley:** No, well, I don't know [D149]
 584 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** Rule 40? Maintain good order that's
 585 all.
 586 **Stuart Povey:** [Talking on the phone] Maintain good order the guy on rule 40.
 587 [D149]: [Inaudible] see me in that stay bruv.
 588 **Callum Tulley:** I wasn't here so.
 589 [D149]: I know you wasn't here. But [inaudible].

590 **Stuart Povey:** Shall I pass you on to Hayley, she knows more about it. I don't know
591 anything about it. One moment. Hayley?
592 **D149**: So I'm gonna cut myself with [inaudible]. See you in a minute.
593 **D149** leaves room]
594 **Hayley (Female Officer – full name unknown):** [Talking on the phone] Hello.
