Callum Tulley: Were you meant to be a Wing officer then when you first started out?

Alex: No, Visits .

Anma Hussain: And you were Visits Staff ?

Alex: That's what annoyed me. I was like kind of like getting moved about. One minute I was on a wing and I had learned something for five minutes. Then, they took me out to do this. And then, eventually, I was asked - I can't remember who I spoke to now. I just said, 'This has got to stop or I'm moving [inaudible].' I'm not going to learn if I'm here for five minutes there for two minutes -

Callum Tulley: Yeah.

Alex: - isn't it?

Anma Hussain: Just put me where you want really, isn't it? Decide.

Callum Tulley: Did they - did you get trained? Did they give you training when you were there on the Wing?

Alex: No. It's because they were running around doing - the other stuff - and I just - ended up getting stuck on the door. And I was like, 'This is not' -

Anma Hussain: Oh, that's ridiculous! Yeah.

Alex: 'This is not what I'm supposed to be doing' Don't - don't -

Anma Hussain: I hate when they do that with new people.

Alex: - put a new person on the door.

Anma Hussain: Yeah. Yeah that's the worst thing to do.

Alex: You have to share the responsibilities.

Anma Hussain: Yeah. And you've got to show them what they've got to do you know?

Alex: Then, they would take the experienced staff member up on escort. They'd bring me and one other like fairly new person maybe from the [inaudible].

Anma Hussain: Yeah but that's the thing they put the - Do you know what I don't like is when they put the responsibility on the old staff to have to train the new staff. That's something like - if you're not going getting paid extra for that well, why should we be doing that?

Callum Tulley: Yes.

Anma Hussain: No. I'm sorry -

Alex: Yeah.

Anma Hussain: - if you're not going to pay the extra [inaudible], why - of course, they're not going to want to train out somebody. They're not - unless you're a really nice person.

Like, the only reason why I'll help out a newbie is because, okay, I had quite a bit of help when I joined. Other than that, why would I?

Alex: I always show people on Visits.

Anma Hussain: Unless you're a douchebag.

Alex: You know what? I've never seen anybody else show anyone -

Callum Tulley: So many people leaving.

Alex: I don't know what I'd do because I think like - I do like this job, but it's just not - it doesn't [inaudible], isn't it?

Anma Hussain: No, don't get me wrong right. I - I don't mind the job, but the - a) money isn't enough, like for - for this job. This kind of job, you need to be getting at least within the 30s . Only because of the environment you're working in and the hours you're doing, you should be getting paid more. You know, SMT are shit. I've said it. And I'll also, in my exit interview, if I do have one, I'll say, 'You are shit.' And what the fuck?

Alex: So -

Callum Tulley: Why do you - why do you reckon the SMT are shit?

Anma Hussain: It is shit because I can say this for a fact like - I've never seen such shit management in my life. Like the way they deal with things, it's so bad. I mean, like for staff, they should be like do - like supporting staff, not like -

Alex: They cut corners a lot.

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Alex: No - no matter what it is, I've gone to them for, it's like they - they'll cut a corner. So even when I did my return to work after being off, they just sort of ticked everything on a computer, basically, and just said, 'Yeah, print it out, sign it. Thank you very much.' I'm like, 'But I haven't really checked that. I haven't read these procedures.'

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Alex: 'I haven't read the notice to staff.'

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Alex: Because when you come back after being off, you have to make sure you've read all the notices to staff, be up to date. And it's like, I haven't done any of that.

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Alex: But I still sort of - like a mug, you just still sign it, don't you?

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Alex: Because it's just...

Anma Hussain: I know. So -

Alex: Nobody reads before they sign it anymore.

Anma Hussain: No.

Alex: Too long.

Anma Hussain: I know. It - it's true. Like even with escorts, you just - you don't actually - you don't read through the paperwork. You don't read for the dangers. You just sign it, don't you?

Alex: Sorry?

Anma Hussain: Have you been able to advance or something?

Alex: No, no.

Anma Hussain: Because I swear, you always get trained to do C&R whenever you want to. Like, I always am -

Alex: Probably because I'm big.

Anma Hussain: Yeah, I always see you in kit.

Alex: Like, they're not going to choose the smallest people, are they? They're going to get the biggest fuckers to do it, like there's usually me and T, standing at the door.

Anma Hussain: Yeah T loves doing C&R though, loves it. Especially if he's on [Inaudible] he loves it like, he's like "I get to literally go [whispered] *smash their faces in*". I mean he's literally said these words to me and I was like 'wow'.

Alex: I've only be ever been on the head never done an arm. I just happen to be the one that's on the head - Cause people have got in there on arms and I've just been the third person. But it's alright.

Anma Hussain: But you're the one giving instructions basically aren't you?

Alex: Erm - Its usually management that do it to be fair. Cause we're the ones that are just trying to focus and get a good - its usually the management that are like 'right' cause they got a good view of what going on. Sometimes like when you're in the moment you're just focusing on what you're doing, not what everyone else is doing.

Anma Hussain: [Inaudible]

Callum Tulley: There's quite a few like who like the C&Rs, do you know what I mean?

Anma Hussain: [Inaudible] loves it.

Alex: I was on one with John Connolly [inaudible]

Anma Hussain: Oh, that is a legend to have on -

Alex: so, he was on an arm

Anma Hussain: [Inaudible] he's really good John. He knows - sorry go on.

Alex: Do you remember the - Who was that guy that left and went back to - he was in the prison service? Tony - funny guy.

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Alex: He was on an arm and I was on the head. And it's funny when they try and sit up and I just put my whole body weight straight on their neck and they're like, "I can't move". So yep, you're not going to [starts to laugh] you're not going to to sit up now. Fuck [inaudible].

Anma Hussain: I mean -

Callum Tulley: Don't you actually think staff are depressed, though?

Anma Hussain: Oh, yeah. 100%. 110%. There are a lot of staff here who've been here for way too long, who have done their time. They're just, unfortunately -

Alex: Maybe not depressed, but burnt out.

Anma Hussain: No, there are definitely some depressed here. I'm 110% sure that's a fact. There are staff members who literally are depressed because of this job because it is. Because coming back to - first of all, Brook doesn't have a very nice environment. I mean, it's - it's not a nice environment to be in, right? Your health gets so fucked up when you're working there. Right? I've left - since I started at Brook, my health has just gone fucking downwards. It's ridiculous. So that's one reason why I wanted to leave. Your managers are absolutely pants. [inaudible] SMT -

Alex: "Brook House Belly" - that's what you - that's what you call it, isn't it?

Callum Tulley: Yeah. That's what I call it -

Anma Hussain: No I call it -

Callum Tulley: So I've - I've - I've started to getting Brook House Belly.

Alex: [inaudible].

Callum Tulley: No. Sorry, carry on. Right. No.

Anma Hussain: No. I call - I call Chief Chris "Great for Shit". That's what I call them. It's - I'm being truthful -

Alex: Yeah, I'd say good for shit.

Anma Hussain: I'd say great for shit because they're actually great at doing shit.

Chris Tulley: [laughs]

Anma Hussain: But no, there's so much I don't like about this job [inaudible]. I don't hate - I don't hate the people I work with. Don't get me wrong - the people are alright I work with, but it's the job, in general. It's - you're not getting paid enough for what you're doing.

Callum Tulley: You feel like it's meaningless.

Anma Hussain: Well, yeah. It's literally like our managers don't really like what they - like, real companies, they want to see career progress and they want to see you do better. They will actually promote you and go, 'Yeah, okay. You should go for this. Why don't you try this? Why don't you try that?' They don't do that here.

Callum Tulley: Yeah. No, I - I understand here -

Anma Hussain: They want you to be stay - they want you to be stuck in one place because you're just a number. You're not - they don't know you by individuals, you're a number. Unless you really have stood out or you've bum licked, then you stand out.

Callum Tulley: Yeah.

Anma Hussain: That's just honesty. [Inaudible] like I said. That's one thing I - I can't deal with. So I'm just speaking.

Callum Tulley: No.

Anma Hussain: I said to the manager to their face; I said it to their face. I said 'I don't like the way things are run here'. And they were like, 'Oh, just give it a try.' Because they kept saying [inaudible] - I had three managers say to me, 'Just give it a try. Like, since - it's not that bad' and I'm like. [Opens eyes wide in disbelief]

Callum Tulley: Yeah. Yeah.

Anma Hussain: It's not the environment. Don't get me wrong. I've done placement in a prison. Do you honestly not think I've -

Callum Tulley: Yeah.

Anma Hussain: -dealt with this before?

Callum Tulley: Yeah.

Anma Hussain: I've dealt with worse. So this is literally - this is not the - it's not the environment that's fazed me at all. Because it's - it's basically a prison environment. It's fine. Actually, lighter.

Callum Tulley: Yeah, I'd say it's not a prison.

Anma Hussain: Really, it's cushy. This is definitely more cushier than a prison. But I found prison had more discipline. Whereas here, you've got no bloody - it's just shitty. It's stupid rules. Stupid rules. Pointless rules for no reason. Like, it's crazy. And then, unnecessary stress to the officers who - for stupid reasons. Like, I don't know. It's just - it doesn't seem like - they don't really give a shit about you and that's the thing. It's because they're all getting paid well. And then, they can just go [inaudible] like 9 to 5 whereas you've actually got to stay here for 12 and half hours that you stay here. A) They're not even paying for your break.

Callum Tulley: Yeah, so it's 13 and a half isn't it?

Anma Hussain: It's ridiculous. But...

Callum Tulley: Yeah, I know.

Anma Hussain: I know.

Callum Tulley: Don't hear many people who'd argue - would argue with that.

Anma Hussain: That's what I'm saying: people leave. That's why you're [inaudible] that. Because so many people are leaving, well, I've got to -

Alex: I've not completed a year yet.

Anma Hussain: Huh?

Alex: I - I've not even completed a year yet.

Anma Hussain: I don't know.

Alex: Like, almost. Actually, it's a year tomorrow is my - contract start date. Because I'm starting to [inaudible] -

Anma Hussain: Is that your ITC date?

Alex: Yeah, that's - yeah, that's the day that you're first getting paid from. So yeah, tomorrow.

Anma Hussain: Right.

Alex: And I've seen so many people come and go.

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Alex: Loads of people. We had a big course. We had 18 or 19 people. And there's not - not many of them left.

Anma Hussain: From my course, two have already left.

Callum Tulley: Yeah. There's only - it's only - on my course, there's only two Brook House officers -

Anma Hussain: Who were they?

Callum Tulley: - who's left, including me.

Anma Hussain: Oh? And who's the other one?

Callum Tulley: It's me, and Ed Fiddy.

Anma Hussain: Oh, yeah.

Alex: On my course, I had people like [inaudible] -

Anma Hussain: You had Craig in your one, didn't you?

Callum Tulley: Craig? He's Tinsley though, isn't he?

Callum Tulley: Did he face any disciplinary - like, did he face any sanctions for that sort of behaviour?

Anma Hussain: [inaudible]. He's still in paid work, though. S1 got warnings against him.

Callum Tulley: In fact, it's funny you say that. He stops me on C-Wing -

Anma Hussain: Yeah.

Callum Tulley: - just as I - as I was attending the First Response. I was, like, coming down busy. But he was saying to me - he was, like, complaining to me that he'd been not cleared for cultural kitchen anymore and I wonder if it's because of his - if, as - as you've been saying, he's made inappropriate comments towards the female members of staff. Detainees who are perceived to be a risk to women and children not allowed to cook in the cultural kitchen, maybe he was trying to ask me what's going on with that? But I - I've - I just - I didn't know about any of the change to his -

Anma Hussain: No.

Callum Tulley: - clearance to cultural kitchen.

Anma Hussain: I know what you mean. But maybe he made her feel really uncomfortable. Yeah, she - she - I think she FIR'd it and she also put it on DAP. And she said that, 'Oh, I'd seen it.' [Inaudible] literally there. And I literally told Kavinder "leave her alone . She's new." Literally, 'Fuck off.' Because he knows that he - he can have - I - I'm alright I had alright banter with him. But after a point, he just started to piss me off. And I got to a point where Precious even [inaudible] getting annoyed. And she was, like, 'You're not even funny, Kavinder. Like, come on. Off you go.' [Inaudible] I literally just blanked him. Like, he was calling me and I blanked him. And he [inaudible], I don't really care. I said that I'm here to work.

Callum Tulley: It's a shame if other detainees are having to pay the price.

Anma Hussain: [inaudible]. It's not fair on them because, like, yeah, it sucks for some of them. Like, they're some, I'm actually, like, 'Okay. You're' -

Callum Tulley: Three in a room.

Detainee: Yes.

Male Officer: [Inaudible]. I'm going to [inaudible] that he was only supposed to be down here for one night because he was going to go back today.

Callum Tulley: To where?

Male Officer: [Inaudible].

Callum Tulley: Oh, right.

Male Officer: But because they put someone in his room. But [inaudible] -

Callum Tulley: Why is he down here in the first place?

Male Officer: Because he cut himself.

Callum Tulley: Oh, but why did he cut himself? That's what I'm ask - that's what I'm wondering. What was that - why is - why is he upset?

Male Officer: [Inaudible].

Callum Tulley: Oh, and now, he's deteriorating because someone's gone into his room? Because C-Wing staff have put detainees in his room when his stuff hasn't been cleared out of the room?

Male Officer: Yeah.

Callum Tulley: Oh, I understand now.

Male Officer: [Inaudible] afraid someone is going to like take his stuff and like -

Callum Tulley: Right.

Male Officer: - [Inaudible].

Callum Tulley: Right. Okay.

Male Officer: So now, he's got to go back to the C Wing.

Callum Tulley: Why did - why did you - why did you - why did you cut yourself in the first place?

Detainee: [Shakes head; does not appear to make eye contact] I don't know

Callum Tulley: You depressed?

Detainee: [Does not respond]

Callum Tulley: Because you're in detention?

Detainee: [Nods] Yes.

Callum Tulley: Understood. I'll get out there -
