


# Security Committee Meeting July 2017

### **Brook House SIRs**

- On average during July Brook House had a roll count of 444 of which 36% were TSFNOs.
- During July 159 SIRs were received which is a decrease of 48 from June, this is the second month reporting has declined.
- There were 143 individuals reported via SIR. Of those, 50% were TSFNO.
- 31 35 were the most frequently reported age group followed by 26-30. Which is a shift from June's reporting of 40-49.
- Kuwait was the most reported population however this was a result of one individual. Albania were the second most reported nationality.



## **Brook House Incident Reports**

- A total of 60 incident reports were submitted capturing a total of 88 categories during July.
- 3 reports were received that related to assaults on staff, a decrease of 7 on June.
- The incident reports concerned 59 individual. TSFNO = 54%.
- The most reported age range was 31-35 followed by 26–30. This is consistent with SIR reporting.
- Detainee's with an unknown nationality were the joint highest reported along with Turkey. This equated to 3 individuals.



# Tinsley House SIRs

- On average during July Tinsley House had a roll count of 135 of which 15% were TSFNOs.
- During July 55 SIRs were received, this was the first full month of reporting since re-opening.
- There were 42 individuals reported via SIR. Of those, 21% were TSFNO.
- 26-30 and 31–35 were joint top for reported age groups.




## Tinsley House IRs

- There were 10 Incident Reports submitted during July capturing a total of 16 categories.
- There were 14 individuals reported, none of who were a TSFNO.
- The most reported age range was 26-30.

### Use Of Force

- There were 20 Uses of Force in July at Brook House used on 15 individuals with no recorded Uses of Force at Tinsley.
- The most frequently restrained age group was 36–39.
- Maintain Good Order and Discipline was the main reasons for force being used by far.
- Force was used twice to prevent Self Harm.

- There were 2 referrals during the month at Brook House.

## **Breaches of Security**

- There were 2 breaches and 4 Key /Lock compromises recorded during July at Tinsley House.
- There were 4 breaches and no key/Lock compromises recorded at Brook House.

# Trends and Hotspots at Gatwick

- There has been clear drug use with in the Centre but with no significant finds being made.
- Clyde and Dove Wing currently sit with many of the challenging detainees and Eden Wing has also experienced many challenges during the month.
- It has still been noted that staff are still not using the warning system to actively manage and challenge poor behaviour.
- Issues continue with detainees gaining access to Wings other than their own. Despite some staff checking ID cards there still seems a distinct lack of a consistent approach.
- The issue of smoking at Tinsley has dominated this Month with prohibited lighters being found. This will no doubt be an on-going issue in the centre due to the smoking restrictions.

# Gatwick Objectives

- Collate and analyse intelligence surrounding the drug culture present on Clyde and Dove Wing.
- Enhance awareness regarding the secure storage and accounting of equipment used across both Centres.
- Reduce Breaches of Security at Tinsley House.
- Disrupt and minimise the current smoking culture at Tinsley House.
