Hi Nikki,

The following recommendation, which was sent out to Jose Luis Domingos to look at the possibility of implementing the recommendation:

8.2.12 The investigation was provided with an extract of PSO 1600 by NTRG, this refers to the role of Healthcare in planned and unplanned Use of Force. Within the document it states: Training - 1.12. It is recommended that Healthcare staff are trained alongside prison officers.

8.2.14 Health Care practitioners within the detention estate receive training on Control & Restraint as per 1.12 above.

In his initial response he stated:

“PSOs don’t really apply to IRCs but perhaps it’s was consulted for comparative purposes? A full C+R course for all Healthcare staff sounds like a wholly disproportionate response, but I don’t know what the issue with HC staff was.

If it’s in the sense of HC staff having an understanding of C+R so they can monitor relocations effectively, I think that’s a great idea, but may have commercial and financial implications.”

The report was sent on to Jose to give him some context as to the recommendation made. Jose also referred this to Frances Hardy and Terry Gibbs for some input. Terry came back with:

“Immediate response is a strong agreement with your thinking. HC staff doing full C+R training is simply not realistic, and there would be strong push back if we suggested it I am confident.”

and Francis responded with:

“with MMPR the healthcare staff at Gatwick just attended an awareness course which might be another option?”

To date I have not had any response to emails sent to Jose for any update on this issue. Bearing in mind the above comments I would be looking to reject the recommendation.
